Ceremony At Nobel Peace Center In Oslo Honors "Global Hindu Leadership"

ajarshi Bhupendra Modi, entrepreneur, peacemaker, and leader of a movement that aims to revive Sanatana Dharma, cultural unity, and global peace through dharmic leadership, organized an event in Oslo honoring four individuals for working toward attaining those goals.

On June 20, 2025, a high-profile ceremony was held at the Nobel Peace Center in Oslo, where the honorary title of "Hindu King" was conferred upon four individuals by Rajarshi Modi, founder of the Adi Shankara Math in Rampur, India.

The awardees included:

Dr. Sudhir Parikh – Padma Shri recipient, U.S.-based physician, philanthropist, and founder of Parikh Worldwide Media, a voice of the global Indian diaspora.

Dr. Deepak Chopra - Internationally acclaimed author and spiritual leader known for integrating Vedanta and Ayurveda into global wellness discourse.

Dr. Romesh Japra – Prominent community leader and interfaith bridge-builder across the United States.

Princess Aswathi Thirunal Gouri Lakshmi Bayi – Memberof the Travancore royal family and celebrated author, preserving India's temple traditions and royal legacy. This event was seen by organizers as a "symbolic

meant to reaffirm the global relevance of Sanatan Dharma, "positioning these leaders as spiritual" trustees of global harmony, dharma, and peace."

"This is a call for dharmic action," Rajarshi Modi

is quoted saying in the press release. "A moment for global Hindu leaders to step forward—not to rule, but to serve. Not to divide, but to unite. The age of spiritual statecraft has returned—and with it, a vision of peace that the world deeply needs.

Rajarshi Bhupendra Modi has been spearheading a movement to revive Hindu culture, dharmic leadership, and the global relevance of Hindu Dharma, the press release said.

On January 2, 2024, during his 75th birthday celebrations, Dr. Modi was conferred the title of "Rajarshi" by all four Shankaracharyas who are regarded as India's "highest spiritual authorities."

This recognition of Rajarshi Modi was reaffirmed a year later at the Maha Kumbh 2025, where he was also presented with the Dharma Dand-a sacred staff symbolizing his spiritual duty to unite Hindus across the world.

To mark this milestone, Rajarshi Modi attended the Kumbh for the first time as a Rajarshi, establishing the Rajarshi Palace, described as "a first-of-its-kind spiritual hospitality hub" where he hosted 7,200 guests from across the world, entirely free of charge. The event

embodied the spirit of "Atithi Devo Bhava" representing

Hinduism's "openness, grace, and grandeur."

"The palace was not just a structure," said a spokesperson. "It was a spiritual statement—showcasing Hinduism not as rigid or regional, but as global, inclusive,

Following the Kumbh, Rajarshi Modi founded the Jagadguru Adi Sankara Math in Rampur, a spiritual and educational institution dedicated to unifying Hindus globally and spreading the teachings of Advaita Vedanta—a timeless philosophy of oneness, peace, and inner

awakening, the press release said.

LAUNCHING THE GLOBAL HINDU KINGS MOVEMENT

Rajarshi Modi then launched a global initiative to nominate 500 "New Age Hindu Kings and Queens"—distinguished individuals above the age of 75, who have demonstrated exceptional commitment to dharma, peace, and cultural leadership. These leaders, drawn from business, philanthropy, medicine, media, and spirituality, are being recognized as flagbearers of Hindu values in the modern world, organizers said.

'New Age Hindu Kings and Queens are not rulers of land but stewards of consciousness," said Rajarshi Modi. "They lead global businesses, generate wealth with purpose, and promote peace through dharmic leadership. They are guardians of tradition, carriers of wisdom, and ambassadors of

harmony—entrusted with carrying Adi Sankara's legacy

into the 21st century."


Dr. Modi says this movement affirms the core Hindu worldview that transcends all boundaries:

Canada, India Agree To Resume Diplomatic Services, Strengthen Trade Ties, Cooperate On Global Priorities

t the G7 Summit held in Kananaskis, Alberta, India and Canada agreed to resume full diplomatic ties, bringing an end to the icy relations triggered by Canadian allegations that Indian agents were involved in the killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, a Canadian citizen designated as a terrorist by India, outside a gurdwara in Canada in 2023.

This was the first in-person interaction between Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney and India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi, since Carney assumed office following Canada's recent general elections. The meeting provided an opportunity for both sides to hold "frank and forward-looking discussions" on the state of India-Canada relations and the way ahead, noted a press release from the Indian government.

The leaders reaffirmed the importance of India-Canada ties, based on shared democratic values, respect for the rule of law. and commitment to upholding the principles of sovereignty and territorial integrity. They underlined the need to pursue a constructive and balanced partnership grounded in mutual respect for concerns and sensitivities, strong people-to-people ties, and growing economic complementarities. In this regard, "both sides agreed to take calibrated and constructive steps to restore stability in the relationship, beginning with the early return of High Commissioners to each other's capitals," the press release said.

Carney and Modi underscored the importance of restarting senior ministerial as well as working-level engagements

across various domains to rebuild trust and bring momentum to the relationship.

They discussed opportunities for future collaboration in areas such as clean

energy, digital transformation, artificial intelligence, LNG, food security, critical minerals, higher education, mobility, and supply chain resilience.

They also reaffirmed their shared

interest in promoting a free and open Indo-Pacific. The leaders also discussed the importance of restarting the stalled negotiations on the Early Progress Trade Agreement (EPTA), with a view to paving the way for a Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA). They agreed to task their respective officials to engage further in this regard, the press release said.

Both leaders acknowledged the important progress made at the G7 Summit and the shared willingness to work constructively together on global priorities such as climate action, inclusive growth, and sustainable development. They also recognized the deep peopleto-people connections between the two countries and agreed to leverage this to the benefit of both countries. They dwelt on the strong and historic ties between their peoples, partnerships in the IndoPacific, and significant commercial links between Canada and India — including partnerships in economic growth, supply chains, and the energy transformation.

Prime Minister Carney also raised priorities on the G7 agenda, including transnational crime and repression, security, and the rules-based order.

The discussions took place even as India-Canada ties remain strained due to ongoing political tensions. India has repeatedly voiced concern over extremism and anti-India activities in Canada, urging Canadian authorities to act against such elements.

The meeting between Carney and Modi could jumpstart a return to normalization of bilateral relations.

Modi also met with each of the G7 leaders at the Summit, well as the invited guest countries like Brazil and South Africa, and leaders of the European Commission and the European Council.

Both Committed Towards Realising Potential Of India-Canada Relationship: Canadian PM Carney On Meet With PM Modi

anadian Prime Minister Mark Carney held a
press conference as the G7 Summit came to its
conclusion, where he answered several pressing
questions, including those on his meeting with
Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Answering a question on the India-Canada ties, PM Carney said, "In terms of the bilateral relationship, I think the meeting today was important. I would describe it as foundational, as a necessary first step, an exchange of views, a frank, open exchange of views around law enforcement, transnational repression as two examples, an agreement to provide the necessary foundations to begin to rebuild a relationship based on mutual respect, sovereignty, trust."

In his remarks, he noted that the two countries would work on appointing their High Commissioners again. Carney told the media, "We will move to appoint high

commissioners again, and let me just finish by putting that in context, which is that there are very deep ties of people and businesses between Canada and India. It's well known, it's part of your point about where the relationship could go. And they are not served at present by consular services in effect—certainly by high commissioners, and it's necessary to have that level of service as a basis on which to build out again in the context of respect for sovereignty and to begin to realise the potential of the relationship, and we will. We're both committed to working towards that, but there's a lot of work that will need to be done."

When asked about the case of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, the Canadian Prime Minister said, "We have had a discussion, Prime Minister (Modi) and I, about the importance of having the law enforcement to law enforcement dialogue, which is cooperation directly; the importance of addressing transnational repression as I noted, when we met, and obviously there is a judicial process that's underway and I need to be careful about further commentary."



G7 Canada: Pahalgam Terror Attack Assault On Entire Humanity, Says PM Modi

rime Minister Narendra Modi addressed a G7 Outreach Session where he called upon countries to strengthen the fight against terrorism and called Pahalgam terror attack not just an assault on India but also on the entire humanity, the Ministry of External Affairs noted in an official statement.

He made the remarks while addressing the G7 Outreach session on the theme 'Energy Security: diversification, technology and infrastructure to ensure access and affordability in a changing world'.

As per the MEA, PM Modi, emphasizing security challenges, called upon countries to strengthen the global fight against terrorism. Thanking the global community for their strong support to India in its fight against terrorism, he expressed that the Pahalgam terror attack was not just an assault on India but on the entire humanity.

"Terrorism is an enemy of humanity. It is against all countries that uphold democratic values", he said.

He called for strict action against countries that support and promote terrorism and noted

that there should be no double standards in dealing with terrorism and those who

support terrorism should never be rewarded.

"On one hand, we are quick to impose all kinds of sanctions based on our own preferences. On the other hand, countries that openly support terrorism are rewarded," said PM Modi.

Calling terrorism a grave threat to humanity, PM Modi put forth three pressing

questions for the international community to ponder over—

-Will countries understand the grave threat posed by terrorism only when they become a

target?

-How can perpetrators of terror and their victims be equated?

-Will global institutions be mute spectators to terrorism?

As per the statement by the MEA, PM Modi expressed that uncertainty and conflicts in various parts of the world have had a debilitating impact on the countries of the Global South, and India took it as its responsibility to make the voice of the Global South heard on the world stage. He underlined that it was important for the world to understand the priorities and concerns of the Global South if the international community was serious about a sustainable future.

Indo-Canadians Welcome PM Modi's Visit To Canada For G7 Summit

rime Minister Narendra Modi's arrival in Canada
for the G7 Summit was warmly welcomed by
members of the Indo-Canadian community, who
hope the visit will mark a turning point in strained
India-Canada relations.

Sumit Singh, a Brampton-based Indo-Canadian businessman and immigration consultant, expressed optimism about the visit. "I wholeheartedly welcome Prime Minister Modi to Canada," he said. "I appreciate Prime Minister Mark Carney's invitation to Mr. Modi. This is a positive step and I hope it leads to the restoration of normalcy in India-Canada relations."

Singh also voiced concern over the impact of diplomatic tensions on the Indian diaspora.

"More than 1.5 million people of Indian origin live in Canada. The deterioration of ties over the past two years has been disheartening for them," he said, adding, "This visit is a sign of hope."

Canadian broadcaster Haleema Sadia also hailed the visit as a diplomatic breakthrough.

"To attend the G7 Summit, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi has arrived in Canada. Our Prime Minister, Mark Carney, has done a tremendous job by extending the invitation and easing tensions," she said.

"There has been a prolonged period of discomfort and concern among Canadians. This invitation, and PM Modi's acceptance, will make a significant difference in improving India-Canada relations," Sadia said.

Vishal Saini, Director of Hindu Forum Canada, also welcomed the visit and emphasised the contribution of Indo-Canadians.

"There are approximately 1.5 million Indo-Canadians who are contributing significantly to both the Indian and Canadian economies," he said. "Prime Minister Modi's visit will further strengthen the cultural and economic ties between the two countries."

Modi's brief visit to Canada excited the diaspora in Calgary and Alberta, who hoped the trip marks the beginning of a stronger partnership between India and Canada.

Nidhi Lodha shared her delight and said the community was thrilled about the visit. "Indian diaspora in Calgary and Alberta is so happy that PM Narendra Modi is visiting us. The only caviar is that it is a last-minute short visit, so we could not organise a town hall where lots of people could meet him. His visit will start a new era of the Canada-India relationship and partnership, which will grow... With the change of government and stance in Ottawa, and the current reality that Canada needs to diversify economically, this relationship will improve..."

Sunny Sharma, a businessman, noted that Prime Minister Modi had come at the invitation of the Canadian Prime Minister. "In other words, the G7 needs India... Carney knows how to do business and not just politics..."

Anil Mehrotra, another member of the diaspora, said, "... I am very happy that he (PM Modi) is visiting Canada and our current Prime Minister had the courage, despite all the negative pressure on him, to invite Modi Ji. He has done a superb job in India, which is now the fourth-largest economy in the world. It would be a grave mistake for Canada not to have invited India. This visit will hopefully only strengthen the good relations we had, which have soured in the last 3-4 years...".

Modi Disputes Trump's Version Of India-Pakistan Ceasefire

ndian Prime Minister Narendra Modi disputed President Donald Trump's claims that trade deals were used to clinch a recent ceasefire with Pakistan, the latest sign of possible strain in the relationship between New Delhi and Washington.

Modi held a 35-minute call with Trump on (June 17) Tuesday night in the US after the two leaders failed to meet in person at the Group of Seven meeting in Canada, India's Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said in a video statement. It was their first conversation since the four-day military strikes between India and Pakistan last month that brought the two neighbors close to war. Trump has consistently said the US helped broker a ceasefire and that he used trade deals as a negotiating tool, comments that Indian officials have disputed.

Modi clarified India's position to Trump during the leaders' call, Misri said Wednesday (June 18).

"PM Modi clearly told President Trump that during this entire incident, at no time, at any level, were there any talks on issues like India-US trade deal or mediation between India and Pakistan through America," he said. "PM Modi stressed that India has never accepted mediation, does not accept it, and will never accept it."

The Indian leader's forthright comments come amid growing frustration in New Delhi over Trump's repeated claims of defusing tensions between the nuclear-armed South Asian rivals. Modi's rebuttal coincides with a tougher Indian stance in trade talks with the US, though analysts say the sharper tone is unlikely to affect negotiations or long-term ties with Washington.

"By outlining the events and India's position, Prime Minister Modi was setting the record straight with President Trump," Harsh Vardhan Shringla, former Indian foreign secretary and envoy to the US said. "The India-US relationship is very comprehensive and will continue to grow."

While speaking to reporters at the White House on

Wednesday, Trump referenced his phone call with the Indian prime minister, saying, "we're going to make a trade deal with Modi of India." However, he also reiterated his version of events: "I stopped the war between Pakistan and India," he said.

The underlying discontent in New Delhi over what it sees as Trump's attempts to place India and Pakistan on equal footing – and undermine its long-standing foreign policy – is far from resolved. Modi echoed that frustration in a speech at the G-7 summit on Tuesday, where he criticized inconsistent global standards on terrorism, without naming any country specifically.

"On the one hand, we are quick to impose various

"On the one hand, we are quick to impose various sanctions based on our own preferences and interests," he said during a session held after Trump had left Canada. "On the other hand, nations that openly support terrorism continue to be rewarded. I have some serious

questions for those present in this room."

New Delhi has said it won't hold talks with Pakistan unless that country takes action to prevent terrorist attacks. The recent military conflict between the two countries was triggered by an April 22 deadly attack on mainly Indian tourists in the Indian-controlled part of Kashmir. India called it a terrorist attack and blamed Pakistan, accusations that Islamabad have denied.

In contrast to India, Pakistan has credited Trump's role in helping negotiate a peace deal and is open to mediation. In an unusual move, Trump is expected to meet with Pakistan's army chief, Asim Munir, at the White House on Wednesday.

Modi's remarks during the phone call may also have been intended to clear up some of the domestic confusion. "The PM needed to clarify this because the confusion that was caused by President Trump," said Indrani Bagchi, chief executive officer at Ananta Centre, a Delhibased think tank. "It was good that the prime minister made that clear to President Trump at his level."

India's opposition groups said additional measures may be needed to address the diplomatic fallout from Trump's version of the truce. Modi remained "silent" for too long, and the US president's assertions went unchallenged, Congress spokesperson Jairam Ramesh told ANI on Wednesday. He asked the prime minister to "say the same things that you have supposedly told President Trump on the phone" at a special session of the parliament.

Trump asked Modi to visit him in the US following his trip to Canada, but "due to prior engagements, Prime Minister Modi expressed his inability to do so," said Misri. Modi had a scheduled stop in Croatia for a state visit before he returned to India from the G-7.

Misri said Trump accepted Modi's invitation to visit India for the annual Quad meet scheduled for later in the year.

US President Trump Accepts PM Modi's Invite To Next Quad Meeting, Leaders Discuss Israel-Iran Conflict

S President Donald Trump has accepted India's invitation to attend the QUAD Summit, which will take place in New Delhi later this year, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said on Wednesday, June 18, 2025.

The telephone conversation with President Trump took place on the sidelines of the G7 Summit in Canada.

"For the next meeting of Quad, PM Modi invited President Trump to India. While accepting the invitation, President Trump said that he is excited to come to India."

Misri said in a video message.

The Quad is a diplomatic partnership between Australia, India, Japan, and the United States committed to supporting an open, stable and prosperous Indo-Pacific that is inclusive and resilient. The Quad's origins date back to our collaboration in response to the December 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami.

Trump and Modi also discussed the ongoing Israel-Iran conflict. On the Russia-Ukraine conflict, both agreed that direct dialogue between the two sides is essential for an early peace, and efforts should continue. The two leaders shared their perspectives on the Indo-Pacific region and expressed support for the important role of QUAD in the region, Migri said

The call comes as Israel and Iran trade drone and missile strikes for a sixth day, with civilians in flashpoint areas facing During the call, Modi briefed Trump on Operation Sindoor and "firmly" conveyed the message that India has not and will not accept any mediation when it comes to issues with Pakistan

Misri also recounted the trajectory of the lastest India-Pakistan conflict, saying, "On the night of May 9, Vice President Vance called Prime Minister Modi. Vice President Vance had said that Pakistan could launch a major attack on India. Prime Minister Modi had told him in clear words that if this happens, India will give an even bigger response to Pakistan. India gave a very strong response to Pakistan's attack on the night of 9-10 May and caused a lot of damage to Pakistan's army. Its military airbases were made inoperable. India's strong response forced Pakistan to urge India to halt military action."

Misri, in his remarks, also highlighted that PM Modi made it clear to President

Trump that during this entire episode, at no time, at any level, were issues such as the India-US trade deal or mediation by the US between India and Pakistan discussed. The halt to military action was discussed directly between India and

Pakistan, through existing channels of the two armies, and was at the request of Pakistan.

Misri emphasized that US President Trump understood the points made in detail by the Prime Minister and expressed support for India's fight against terrorism.



Indian American Lawmakers' Names Were On Minnesota Killer's List

ongressman Raja Krishnamoorthi, D-Illinois, one of several Indian Americans in Congress, was on the list of the Minnesota killer who targeted and shot to death the State Speaker Melissa Hortman and her husband Mark recently, and injured two others. Another Indian American lawmaker, Shri Thanedar, D-Michigan, was also on Vance Boelter's list of individuals he intended to kill, news reports said.

"I have been informed that my name was included in the notes of the Minnesota suspect accused of assassinating an elected official,

murdering her husband, and targeting others," Krishnamoorthi said in a statement responding to the news.

'This brutal attack was devastating and terrifying on many levels. Priya and I have spent much of the last few days thinking about Rep. Hortman and her husband Mark, as well as Sen. Hoffman and his wife Yvette," Krishnamoorthi said, adding, "Political violence has no place in America -full stop. Even in this time of great division, we should all agree on that."

Senator Tammy Baldwin, D-Wisconsin, Rep. Debbie Dingell, D-Michigan, and some other Democrats were also on Boelter's list, news reports said.



Reps. Krishnamoorthi And Jackson Demand Access To South Loop ICE Facility To Perform Oversight After Being Turned Away

ust days after their attempt to conduct oversight at an Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) facility in the South Loop of Chicago was denied, Congressmen Raja Krishnamoorthi (D-IL) and Jonathan Jackson (D-IL) sent a letter to Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem demanding immediate access to the facility and full transparency around recent detentions and conditions inside.

"We were denied the ability to perform congressional oversight – as is our duty as members of the United States

House of Representatives," the lawmakers wrote, adding, "During the visit to this facility, the ICE officer who refused to identify himself called the Chicago Police Department to evict us for 'trespassing.'"

The visit by Congressmen Krishnamoorthi and Jackson came after what they describe as disturbing reports that on June 4, ICE officials detained at least 10 individuals after sending them text messages instructing them to appear at the facility for a "routine appointment."

"It is unclear exactly how many people were taken, where they were taken to, and if they were given access to counsel," the lawmakers wrote of the incident. "We were denied those answers," they said, quoting from the letter in a press release

June 23.

The two lawmakers called the targeting of Chicago and other "Democratic cities" by ICE as "politically motivated" and "deeply troubling."

"Given the serious and potentially illegal nature of the activity in these reports, we request that the Department of Homeland Security allow Members of Congress to access the South Loop facility for the purpose of investigating their activity further. Please issue a response by Friday, June 27." the letter to Noem concludes.

India Will Ensure Domestic Fuel Supply Despite Middle East Tension

ndia will take measures to safeguard domestic fuel supplies, oil minister Hardeep Singh Puri said on Sunday, after U.S. attacks on Iran's nuclear sites raised the risk of disruption of Middle Eastern oil and gas and soaring energy prices.

Energy markets and investors were already on high alert since Israel launched airstrikes across Iran on June 13, fearing disruption particularly through the Strait of Hormuz.

Around 20% of global oil and gas demand flows through the Strait that Iran has long threatened to close it to exert pressure on the West.

"We have been closely monitoring the evolving geopolitical situation in the Middle East since the past two weeks... we have diversified our supplies in the past few years and a large volume of our supplies do not come through the Strait of Hormuz now," Puri said on social media platform X.

"Our Oil Marketing Companies have supplies of several weeks and continue to receive energy supplies from several routes. We will take all necessary steps to ensure stability of supplies of fuel to our citizens," he said.

India, the world's third biggest oil importer and consumer, gets less than half of its average 4.8 million barrels per day of oil imports from the Middle East.

Separately Puri told local news agency ANI that India would increase crude supplies from other sources if required. "We are in touch with all possible actors... It is our hope, and we all expect that the situation will result in calm and de-escalation rather than further escalation," he said.

Earlier in the day Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi received a phone call from Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian, in which he was briefed about the conflict between Iran and Israel, India's foreign ministry

Indian Pilgrims Cross Chinese Border Into Tibet As Relations Thaw

religious pilgrimage from India into China facilitated by both governments has resumed for the first time in five years – the latest sign of a cautious thaw in the contentious relationship between the world's two most populous nations.

The first batch of Indian pilgrims taking part in the Kailash Manasarovar Yatra – named for the two Tibetan sacred sites the route traverses – left New Delhi on Sunday morning and crossed the mountainous border into China's Tibet Autonomous Region on Friday.

The group of roughly 40 pilgrims acclimatized to the high Himalayan altitudes in the northern Indian state of Sikkim before setting off for a cross-border mountain pass 14,000 feet above sea level. The pilgrimage is set to conclude June 27 at Tibet's Manasarovar Lake, in the shadow of Mount Kailash, a site Hindus believe to be the dwelling of the deity Lord Shiva. The sites are also sacred to adherents of other religions, including Buddhism and Jainism.

Upender Rao, 64, a lawyer from Hyderabad in southern India, considers himself "most fortunate" to be one of 750 pilgrims chosen by lottery to take part in the trip, which India's Foreign Ministry planned meticulously. "I am a devotee of Lord Shiva," so "I want to see the world of Lord Shiva," he said in a phone interview. "That's my dream."

It is a dream that Rao has had to put on hold for the past five years. The 2020 pilgrimage was canceled because of the coronavirus pandemic, and subsequent pilgrimages were halted after June 2020, when Chinese and Indian soldiers clashed over disputed territory high in the Himalayas. At least four Chinese and 20 Indian soldiers died in the conflicts, which both sides fought without modern weapons in an apparent effort to avoid escalation.

The Kailash Manasarovar pilgrimage has long served as a bellwether for the state of relations between India and China, which have clashed sporadically for six decades along a disputed, 2,100-mile-long (3,400-kilometer-long) land border stretching from central Asia to the edges of Southeast Asia.

The border is not the only politically fraught area the pilgrims traverse: Beijing imposes tight restrictions on religious freedom in Tibet, which China annexed in 1951 over the objections of India. Since 1959, India has hosted the Dalai Lama, the Tibetan Buddhist religious leader, and the Tibetan government in exile.

The pilgrimage, which crosses into Tibet, could inflame those sensitivities. According to Rao, the Indian Foreign Ministry's predeparture briefing warned the pilgrims not to praise or talk about the Dalai Lama.

dates to the mid-20th century, when the pilgrimage was brought up during talks to settle a boundary line between the two countries.

In the resulting 1954 Sino-Indian agreement, the logistics of the pilgrimage were settled – but the location of the border was not. As tensions mounted over disputed territory, China invaded India in 1962. China's decisive victory in the subsequent war brought China-India relations, and the pilgrimage, to a halt.

Nearly two decades later in 1981, a new generation of Chinese and Indian leaders negotiated to reopen the pilgrimage, talks that served as a precursor to negotiating a full renormalization of ties in 1988. Still, the countries failed to agree on a boundary line, and tense border standoffs – in 1987, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2017 – remained a mainstay of India-China relations.

After the clashes of 2020, which brought the bilateral relationship to its lowest point in four decades, China sealed the Tibetan border with India, while India banned 59 Chinese-made apps – including TikTok – and vowed to become self-reliant and separate itself from Chinese imports. India also increased its security engagement with the Quad, the informal diplomatic grouping of the United States, India, Japan and Australia, in a move toward countering Chinese power and influence.

At the same time, India and China have both backed away from further aggression. "There's always a risk of unintended clashes" at the border, said Ashok Kantha, the Indian ambassador to China from 2014 to 2016. "I don't think either side would like that to happen. Finding a modus vivendi, even though we may have our different interests that are not always convergent, is most desir-

able."

Since the nadir of June 2020 – and minor clashes in 2021 and 2022 – the India-China relationship has shown signs of a slow recovery. Last October, the two sides announced an agreement to resume regular border patrols and committed "to bring the relationship back to sound and steady development at an early date," the Chinese Foreign Ministry said in a statement. Visits between top officials, including Chinese leader Xi Jinping and Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, followed.

Beijing and New Delhi both have touted the restoration of the Kailash Manasarovar pilgrimage as one of the chief diplomatic breakthroughs to emerge from the rapprochement. China hopes the pilgrims will not only be "spiritually enriched but also enjoy hospitality of Chinese people," Yu Jing, the spokeswoman of the Chinese Embassy in Delhi, said in a social media post.

"From our side, there was interest" in resuming the pilgrimage, "because this resonates quite strongly at the popular level," said Kantha, who worked on expanding pilgrimage routes during his tenure as ambassador. "The number of pilgrims is relatively small, but there is sentimental value attached to" the Kailash Manasarovar Yatra.

Yet an agreement such as this is "low-hanging fruit," Kantha cautioned. The major geopolitical questions in the India-China relationship remain unresolved: Although last October's agreement re-established buffer zones along the border, no progress has been made on demarcating the boundary line between the two countries, and there has yet to be a drawdown from the high number of soldiers deployed to the border region by both sides since 2020.

The India-China relationship was further strained during last month's India-Pakistan clashes, which saw Pakistan using Chinese-made jets to shoot down Indian warplanes. Beijing's implicit support for its longtime ally during the conflict "was not very helpful," Kantha said. "The level of deference between China-Pakistan came to the fore and created serious misgivings in India. I don't think that has helped us rebuild relations."

Normalizing relations "will be easier said than done," said Chietigj Bajpaee, a senior research fellow at Chatham House who specializes in Asian affairs. "The resumption of the Kailash Manasarovar Yatra is more symbolism than substance given the bad blood in the bilateral relationshin"

For all the high-level geopolitics at play, though, Rao was pleasantly surprised to encounter a more personal reality on the ground. The pilgrims spent their first night in China at Kangma, a village some 100 miles (about 161 kilometers) behind the border, and met Tibetans for the first time. "Their hospitality is very good," Rao said.

Business Immigration Options for F-1 Students

Many international students enter the United States on an F-1 visa with hopes of completing their degree and launching a career. But what happens if things change - you pause your studies or decide that the academic path isn't right for

If you're an F-1 student who is not graduating, but want to stay in the U.S. legally and pursue a future in business or entrepreneurship, there are several immigration options that may be worth exploring - including business-based visas and the EB-5 Immigrant Investor Program.

Can I Stay in the U.S. Without Finishing My Degree?

If you're not completing your program, your F-1 status is at risk. Generally, F-1 students must maintain full-time enrollment to stay in status. Dropping out or falling below the required course load without authorization may lead to termination of your SEVIS record.

That said, you may still have options. But it's important to take action before falling out of status.

1. Business Immigration: L-1, E-2, or H-1B (If You Qualify)

Depending on your background and resources, a shift into a business-related nonimmigrant visa might work. Here are a few possibilities:

L-1 Intracompany Transfer

If you previously worked for a business abroad for at least one year in the past three years, and that business plans to expand into the U.S., you may qualify for the <u>L-1 visa</u>. This is commonly used for startup founders launching a U.S. branch of their foreign company.

- L-1A is for executives and managers
- L-1B is for employees with specialized knowledge
- Can lead to a green card under the EB-1C category

E-2 Treaty Investor Visa

If you are from a country with a qualifying treaty with the U.S. (such as Canada, Japan, or the U.K.), and you have the ability to make a substantial investment in a U.S. business, the E-2 visa may be an option.

- Requires at least 50% ownership in the U.S. company
- You must be actively involved in managing the business
- With strategic planning, E-2 investors may transition to permanent residence through other eligible categories.

Note: Students from India, China, or Brazil are not eligible for the E-2 due to treaty limitations.

H-1B for Specialty Occupations

If you leave school but already hold a bachelor's degree (from your home country or from partial U.S. studies), you may be eligible for H-1B sponsorship from a U.S. employer. However, this route is limited due to the annual H-1B cap and lottery system.

2. EB-5 Immigrant Investor Green Card

If you have access to significant funds and want a direct path to permanent residence, the EB-5 program might be worth considering.

Key Requirements:

- Invest \$800,000 (or \$1,050,000 depending on location) in a new commercial enterprise
- Create at least 10 full-time jobs for U.S. workers
- The investment must be at risk, meaning you cannot be guaranteed a
- You can invest directly or through a Regional Center project

EB-5 is a green card option designed for investors seeking long-term stability in the U.S.

Operation Sindhu: India To Operate 3 More Evacuation Flights From Iran; 162 Indians In Jordan To Return Soon

he Indian government has scheduled three additional evacuation flights from Iran over the next two to three days as part of its ongoing Operation Sindhu, Union Minister of State for External Affairs Pabitra Margherita said on Sunday June 22, 2025.

Speaking to reporters after receiving a new batch of 285 Indian nationals evacuated from the conflict-hit Iran at the Delhi Airport, Margherita said that 162 Indian nationals who had crossed into Jordan from Israel would be repatriated "within a day or two."

"We have scheduled to have three more flights from Iran in the next two to three days. In the same way, we are in constant contact with Indian nations in Iran as well as Israel... 162 Indian nationals have crossed the border to Jordan, and within a day or two, they will be brought back to India," the minister said.

The group of 285 evacuees, who arrived on a special flight from Mashhad, included people from several states such as Bihar, Jammu and Kashmir, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Gujarat, and Maharashtra.

"Special evacuation flight has arrived in New Delhi Airport... carrying 285 Indian nationals... Mainly from 10 states... Bihar, Jammu and Kashmir, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Gujarat and Maharashtra... The total number now stands at 1713," Margherita added.

The evacuees were welcomed by the Union Minister of State for External Affairs, Pabitra Margherita, after they landed at the Delhi Airport, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) stated.

In a post on X, the MEA stated, "India's evacuation ef-

forts continue under Operation Sindhu. MoS Shri Pabitra Margherita received 285 Indian nationals evacuated on a special flight from Mashhad that landed in New Delhi at 2330 hrs on 22 June."

"With this, 1,713 Indian nationals have now been brought home from Iran," it added. Meanwhile, MoS Margherita, in a post on X, expressed his satisfaction with the ongoing operation, stating, "Warmly welcomed 285 Indian nationals at the Delhi airport who were evacuated from Iran under Operation Sindhu. With this, 1,713 Indian nationals have been brought home safely from Iran."

Why some destinations are ditching fireworks for July Fourth

For the second year in a row, Honey and Leo Foster-Ezring will celebrate Independence Day at a resort on Maryland's Tilghman Island. The pair will swim in the Chesapeake Bay, dine at Tickler's Crab Shack and laze in a hammock. Best of all, they won't spend the holiday hiding in the bathroom shower because Tilghman Island does not hold an official fireworks display.

Honey and Leo, both rescue dogs residing in Northeast Washington, are part of a wider population sensitive to loud noises, crowds and other sensory disruptions often associated with firework displays. Every July Fourth, animal care advocates warn owners about the adverse effects the explosions can have on pets, such as stress or anxiety and the urge to cower or bolt.

"Animal shelters around the country report a huge increase in the number of dogs and cats who are taken in around the Fourth of July because the animals are terrified by these loud explosions," said Jakob Shaw, manager of strategic initiatives for People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA). "They'll run away from backyards; they'll jump through windows. So in addition to the trauma of fireworks, there's so much injury and loss."

The star-spangled spectacles can also distress neurodivergent people and other vulnerable individuals, such as war veterans who might suffer from post-traumatic stress disorder and senior citizens. In addition to the booms of fireworks and congested viewing spots, the flashing or shimmering lights, pungent food smells and change in routine can be a source of discomfort.

"July Fourth doesn't just hit one sensory system. It hits a lot," said Rebecca Landa, founder and executive director of the Center for Autism Services, Science and Innovation at Kennedy Krieger Institute in Baltimore. "Multiple sensory systems are being challenged, and that can be a trigger for behavioral and emotional dysregulation."

To ensure a happy and healthy holiday, people and pets can find a getaway that meets their specific needs: no fireworks or alternative displays, open spaces, few crowds. Destinations such as Aspen, Colorado; San Diego's La Jolla neighborhood; and Lincoln City, Oregon, have ditched their fireworks for more benevolent light shows. For Honey and Leo, that place is Tilghman Island.

"I'd much rather see Honey rolling in the grass or swimming in the bay than shaking in the shower," said Adam Ezring, 47, a deputy director of an education nonprofit. He will spend the once-anxiety-ridden day chilling at the Wylder Hotel with his wife and two pups.

Sporting events and theme parks go fireworks-free

Fireworks, an innovation credited to ancient China, have been a Fourth of July tradition in the United States since 1777, according to the American Pyrotechnics Association. In more recent times, many communities, theme parks and high-profile events have been introducing gentler alternatives, such as light shows produced by drones and lasers.

Both creative formats are much quieter than pyrotechnics. The volume level of drones is around 60 to 65 decibels, said Hayes Walsh, creative content director of Sky Elements Drones, a drone show provider. By comparison, fireworks can be as ear-shattering as the blast of a jet engine taking off, which registers at about 140 decibels.

"If you were to stand at the takeoff point, you would definitely hear a buzz," said travel reporter Sally French, a drone enthusiast who founded the Drone Girl blog in 2013. "But if you were in an audience, you would never hear it. I do hear from dog owners who say this is so much better."

Since the world's first commercial drone light show in 2012, at an Austrian music festival, French has seen an increase in the frequency and profile of this type of choreographed performance.

Unmanned aerial vehicles shared the stage with Lady Gaga at the 2017 Super Bowl in Houston and with Olympians in the 2020 Opening Ceremonies in Tokyo, held in 2021 because of the pandemic. Both also featured fireworks. In January last year, Disneyland Paris unveiled an evening parade with more than 500 drones, lasers, video projections, lights and fountains. Grant's Farm in St. Louis runs a "drone show spectacular" on summer weekends. And they have started appearing on the biggest fireworks day of the year.

Drone shows from Colorado to Michigan

For the holiday, Sky Elements Drones will perform more than 40 shows in 10 states. Though some of the displays will incorporate fireworks, the event in Lincoln City, Oregon, which prohibits fireworks on private and public property, will be drones-only.

BringFido, a pet travel site, has nearly 20 dog-friendly shindigs, several of which are fireworks-free, such as a bash at Cannon Beach, Oregon. PETA compiles an annual list of fireworks-free destinations. So far for this year, the count is up to 15. "Cities, resorts and parade festivals around the country that switch to fireworks-free celebrations are better for animals, people with PTSD and neurodivergent people, and are just more in keeping with the more sustainable way that many of us want to live these days," Shaw said.

Since at least 2018, Aspen had been reconsidering its use of fireworks because of wildfire threats to drought-stricken Colorado. In 2021, the town ditched them for eco-friendly, nonflammable lasers. A spark can be devastating: According to the National Fire Protection Association, fireworks caused an estimated 31,302 conflagrations in 2022. This July Fourth, Aspen will entertain the crowds with the 15-minute Symphony of Freedom, wholly performed by drones.

"Aspen is very much concerned about the natural environment and the impact that loud noises and vibrations have on the ecosystem," said Mike Harrington, executive director of the Wheeler Opera House in Aspen. "So this is certainly a step in a positive direction."

In Michigan's Upper Peninsula, Susan Estler, chief executive at Travel Marquette, said she worked with local groups, including seniors and veterans, on the town's festivities. Since 2023, Marquette has held separate events, with fireworks and a laser show on July 3 and the Sensory Friendly Laser Show, the largest architectural laser show in North America, on the Fourth.

"We had feedback from the veterans home about how much the veterans appreciated the fact it was just the sensory show on the Fourth of July," Estler said. "Sustainability is important. Accessibility is important, as well as being inclusive."



How to manage sensory triggers

Cities and event spaces can reduce the sensory overload but not eliminate it. Most illumination shows are set to music. Spectators amass in viewing areas. Food trucks and cookouts emit strong odors. Even in communities without a sanctioned fireworks show, visitors may see and hear sparklers ignited by residents or neighboring towns.

Neurodivergent professionals encourage celebrants to take precautionary steps to mitigate any potentially stressful situations. Families should look for "sensory-friendly designations, calm areas, and staff trained to better support autism and neurodiverse populations," said Kristyn Roth, chief marketing officer for the Autism Society of America. The organization's national helpline has specialists who can assist with summer travel planning, including holiday trips.

Sam Brandsen, a member of its council of autistic advisers and the autistic parent of an autistic child, prepares his son by "coming up with little stories that help him know what to expect - that there's going to be unexpected noises or fireworks." He said libraries are a comforting option for his 7-year-old. In addition to arranging holiday-themed events or displays, Brandsen said, "they are a lot more sensory- and kid-friendly."

For the Fourth, Maureen Dunne, a cognitive scientist and neurodiversity specialist, recommends packing a kit with such essentials as noise-canceling headphones and sunglasses to temper the lights display. A fragrant spray can help mask strong smells.

To insulate yourself from external triggers, Landa suggests booking a hotel room with a stellar view of the festivities, or ask the hotel whether it has an enclosed observation deck. If the host destination is streaming or recording the event, you can watch the show in your room and control the audio settings.

"I was with a friend once who, instead of going to the fireworks, really liked to watch them on TV and turn the volume off," said Dunne, who will attend Aspen's festivities with her husband and triplets.

If the most comforting option is to skip the spectacle all together, spend the holiday in a national park or national forest, both of which prohibit fireworks. Most public lands allow dogs, with some restrictions.

Sholay Celebrates 50 Years With World Premiere Of Restored Version At II Cinema Ritrovato Festival

Audiences will have the unique opportunity to see the original ending and previously deleted scenes that were not part of the widely-distributed theatrical cut, offering a fresh perspective on a cinematic masterpiece.


Dharmendra states, "Sholay is the

Shivendra Singh Dungarpur, Director, Film Heritage Foundation states, "My first memory of Sholay dates back to the time when I was six years old and I remember lamenting because my mother refused to allow me to go to the cinema to watch the film. I would never have imagined that 50 vears later, I would have the opportunity to work on the restoration of the film often described as the greatest Indian film ever made - with Shehzad Sippy of Sippy Films. I know every frame and every dialogue of the film by heart. Sholay was a masterpiece of passion that generations of Indians have loved and seen time and time again. Despite the fact that we could not use the original camera negative and

that not a single 70mm print survives, we have left no stone unturned to ensure that this historic film has not only been beautifully restored, but that the restored version that will premiere in Bologna will have the original ending and some neverbefore-seen deleted scenes. I can't wait to watch the film in the open air in the Piazza in Bologna along with thousands of cinephiles from around the world."

Shehzad Sippy, producer, Sippy Films, adds, "Our film is the cornerstone of our family heritage and I am so proud that Sippy Films has been able to do a world-class restoration of the film with Film Heritage Foundation. It has taken us three years, but we were able to find the original ending and some deleted scenes that the world will see for the first time at the grand premiere at the Il Cinema Ritrovato Festival in Bologna. It's been a labor of love to resurrect the film and this is a tribute to the vision and the legacy of my grandfather, G.P. Sippy. I can't wait for the film to begin its new lease of life."

The screening in Piazza Maggiore is expected to draw a large crowd of film enthusiasts, critics and the general public, all eager to experience this legendary film in a truly exceptional setting. The Il Cinema Ritrovato Festival is renowned for its dedication to showcasing restored and classic films, making it the ideal venue for this significant premiere.

The restoration ensures that future generations can appreciate the film's artistic and cultural significance in its most authentic form. This world premiere marks not just a celebration of a film, but a recognition of its enduring power and its place in global cinematic history.

ABOUT THE RESTORATION PROCESS

In 2022, Shehzad Sippy of Sippy Films initiated discussions with the Film Heritage Foundation regarding the restoration of Sholay. He indicated that the film elements were housed in a Mumbai warehouse and expressed his desire to entrust them to the care of Film Heritage Foundation for preservation. Upon exam-

ining the contents of the film cans, which lacked labels, Film Heritage Foundation made the remarkable discovery that they contained the original 35mm camera and sound negatives of the film. Ramesh Sippy visited the archival office to witness this extraordinary find, visibly moved by the survival of these original film components. Shehzad Sippy further informed the Film Heritage Foundation of additional film elements stored at Iron Mountain in the UK. With invaluable assistance from the esteemed British Film Institute, Film Heritage Foundation were granted access to these materials. Subsequently, the reels from both London and Mumbai were transported to L'Immagine Ritrovata in Bologna to commence the intricate restoration process.

The restoration proved to be a complex endeavor, spanning nearly three years. The primary challenge lay in the condition of the original camera negative, which was severely deteriorated and thus unsuitable for the restoration. Consequently, the restoration predominantly utilized the interpositives located in London and Mumbai. Fortuitously, the color reversal intermediate discovered in London remarkably contained the original ending and two previously deleted scenes. Film Heritage Foundation had also successfully acquired the original Arri 2C camera instrumental in the filming of Sholay.

Given the absence of 70mm prints, Film Heritage Foundation consulted with veteran cinematographer Kamlakar Rao (Karz, Hero, Karma), who had collaborated on Sholay with the film's cinematographer, Dwarka Divecha. "Rao recounted Divecha's technique of employing a ground glass in front of the camera lens, upon which Rao made markings to delineate the margins of the 70mm frame. This invaluable insight guided our decision to adopt a 2.2:1 Aspect Ratio for the restored film. Adding to Film Heritage Foundation's good fortune, the original magnetic sound elements were located at the Sippy Films office. The sound restoration was meticulously conducted utilizing both the original sound negative and these magnetic elements.

The final restored version is a culmination of efforts based on two inter-positives and two color reversal intermediates, incorporating the original ending and the deleted scenes, thereby reviving the director's authentic vision for the film.

Interestingly, the content of the film, originally released in 70mm and as India's first film in Stereophonic Sound, was so strong that audiences rejected the conversion of the film into a 3D version released in 2014




