

It was a highly successful meeting that sought to bridge medical expertise with technological innovation and networking to build a better health care system for future generations

Among the highlights of the convention was the handover of the gavel from outgoing President Dr. Satheesh Kathula to incoming President Dr. Amit Chakrabarty, as well as Dr. Hetal Gor taking charge as Chair of the Board of Trustees.



The Convention was held at the Cincinnati Marriott at RiverCenter and Northern Kentucky Convention Center, concluding with a colorful gala and the official handing over of leadership.

Dr. Chakrabarty's executive committee consists of President-Elect Dr. Meher Medavaram, Vice President Dr. Krishan Kumar, Secretary Dr. Seema Arora, and Dr. Soumya Neravetla as Treasurer. Dr. Gautam Kamthan will serve as the President, YPS, and Dr. Priyanka Kolli is the President, MSRF, both, representing the Medical Students and Fellows at the national AAPI.

Dr. Chakrabarty called it a "sacred beginning" for the largest ethnic medical association, and said he was committed to unifying it, and strengthening links with policymakers. "With this new chapter, we honor our heritage, step forward with courage, and vow to lead with integrity.

AAPI represents the interests of over 120,000 Indian American physicians, Residents, and Fellows, and is the second largest medical organization after the American Medical Association.

Outgoing President Dr. Kathula highlighted the programs and initiatives he and his executive committee had fulfilled in the past year. Among the leaders who organized the Convention, Dr. Vijaya Kodali was recognized for her hard work.



Dr. Sudhir Parikh, Chairman of Parikh Worldwide Media/ITV Gold, was a distinguished guest. He spoke about his inspiring journey and his philanthropic work. From being a physician, and working to strengthen US-India relations, establishing a major publishing house with the goal of empowering the younger generation and bringing the American public closer to India. His work as a philanthropist, including with Life Global USA, establishing more than 100 schools in India. As the incoming President of the Global Association of Physicians of Indian Origin, GAPIO, he aims to help train young physicians in India and bring experts from around the world to

help improve India's healthcare services, enable placement of doctors coming to US in various hospitals, and also strengthening exchanges with top universities in US.

Dr. Sunil Kaza, the outgoing BOT Chair, spoke of challenges faced and Dr. Gore shared her journey to becoming Chair of the BOT, and her plans for the future of AAPI.

Lieutenant Governor of Kentucky Jacqueline Coleman was joined for the lamp-lighting and ribbon-cutting ceremony, by Dr. Bobby Mukkamala, president of the American Medical Association, Dr. D Nageshwar Reddy, a Padma Vibhushan awardee, and AAPI executives. The national anthems of both the US and India were performed by Dr. Aarti Pandya.

Apart from Dr. Mukkamala and Dr. Reddy, other speakers at the Convention included Dr. Lyuba Konopasek, MD, Senior Vice President, Intealth/ECFMG, Executive Director, FAIMER; Michael Suk, MD, BOT Chair, AMA; George Abraham, MD, Chair, Federation of State Medical Boards.

Dr. Mario Capecchi, a 2007 Nobel laureate in Medicine/Physiology for his contributions to the development of "Mouse knockout technology" delivered the keynote address.

And Dr. Mukkamala, in his keynote address, said, "I've been an AAPI member since I started medical school, and I'm an AMA member. But it's like having a left hand and a right hand that don't interact much. And that needs to be improved." He added, "I'm excited to be the first Indian descent president of the AMA to integrate that more. So that AAPI and the AMA both work together to improve physicians' ability to take care of patients and the health of this country. Both are critical to make that happen, and if two critical aspects aren't working together. We can work together, and we can watch them grow exponentially. When we work together, it will be exponential growth for both organizations."

Kentucky Lt. Governor Coleman praised AAPI members for their sacrifices, adding, "...you are the reason that the Governor and I refer to you as a title you have truly earned, which is Healthcare Heroes. So, thank you for what you do."

Mayor of Cincinnati Aftab Pureval, shared his life story as a child born to refugees from the Himalayas, to the United States. "And it's because of trailblazers like you that next generations like me and my brother can pursue our dreams in whatever field that may be. Congratulations everybody! So excited for you to choose Cincinnati, and I hope you have a wonderful conference."

Artificial Intelligence emerged as a critical theme, with Dr. Suresh Reddy and Dr. Nageshwara Rao explored AI's transformative potential in healthcare delivery and patient management, while highlighting ethical considerations in medical technology.

Daily morning programs focused on sleep techniques and anxiety management, providing physicians innovative strategies for personal and professional well-being, emphasizing holistic professional development.

The Medical Licensing Forum, led by Dr. Amol Soin, brought together state medical board representatives to discuss critical practice pathways

Neravetla, and others praised the Convention's collaborative effort to shape the future of healthcare on a global scale.

Promising Army Cadet Neil Edara Of New Jersey Dies During Training

he U.S. Army Cadet Command (ROTC) reported the death of one of its cadets in the course of training in a post on Facebook July 26, 2025. An investigation is ongoing into the death of Cadet Neil Edara of Ridge wood, N.J., who was attending Cadet Summer Training in Kentucky.

'Cadet Edara was one of the most dedicated and promising young leaders I've had the privilege to know," Lt. Col. Timothy Sorensen, professor of military science, Rutgers University, said. "His calm collected demeanor and unwavering commitment to excellence left a lasting impact on everyone around him. His loss is deeply felt across the entire ROTC and Rutgers community. Our thoughts and prayers are with his family and loved ones during this incredibly difficult time.'

He passed away during training on the Land Navigation site on July 24, 2025, on

Fort Knox, Ky, the FB post said.
Edara joined ROTC at Rutgers University in September 2021. He was attending

pronounced deceased by medical professionals," the Army Cadet Command said in the FB post.

At this time, the cause of death is under investigation.

The agency said the safety of cadets and cadre remains U.S. Army Cadet Command's top priority as training continues, and that the Cadets have access to religious affairs or spiritual counseling and support as required.

A web search indicates, Neil Edara was the son of Varalakshmi L. Edara, a licensed Social Worker, and Srinivasa Edara, a software engineer. Other relatives include Nina Edara, and Prayeena Edara, A call to the number listed for Varalakshmi Edara received no response.

First Deputy Managing Director Gita Gopinath Leaving IMF To Rejoin Harvard

he International Monetary Fund (IMF) announced July 21, that Gita Gopinath, First Deputy Managing Director (FDMD), would be leaving the Fund at the end of August to return to Harvard University. Gopinath was the first female Chief Economist in IMF history.

At Harvard, Gopinath will be the inaugural Gregory and Ania Coffey Professor of Economics in the Department of Economics, Harvard University said in its press

Gopinath joined the Fund in January 2019 as Chief Economist and was promoted to First Deputy Managing Director in January 2022.

The IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva is quoted saying, "Gita has been an outstanding colleague—an exceptional intellectual leader, dedicated to the mission and members of the Fund, and a fabulous manager, always showing genuine care for the professional standing and wellbeing of our staff."

Georgieva added, "She (Gopinath) came to the Fund as a highly respected academic in macroeconomics and international finance. Admiration for Gita only grew through her time at the Fund, where her analytical rigor was paired with practical policy advice to the membership during an especially challenging period, which included the pandemic, wars, the cost-of-living crisis, and major shifts in the global trading system.

Gopinath oversaw the Fund's multilateral surveillance and analytical work on fiscal and monetary policy, debt, and international trade. She is credited by IMF of making a "a strong contribution to systemic country surveillance and to Fund country programs, including those for Argentina and Ukraine.

Georgieva also praised Gopinath for her role in international forums like the G-7 and G-20, and for ensuring that the annual World Economic Outlook report "remained the preeminent report on the global economy"; spearheading the Fund's work on the Integrated Policy Framework (IPF); co-authoring the Pandemic Plan on how to end the COVID19 crisis – especially important for laying out targets to vaccinate the world at a feasible cost.

India-US Interim Trade Deal Prospects Dim Ahead Of Tariff Deadline, Sources Say

he prospects of an interim trade deal between India and the United States before Washington's August 1 deadline have dimmed, as talks remain deadlocked over tariff cuts on key agricultural and dairy products, two Indian government sources said.

U.S. President Donald Trump threatened a 26% tariff on Indian imports in April but paused implementation to allow for talks. That pause ends on August 1, though India has yet to receive a formal tariff letter, unlike over 20 other coun-

India's trade delegation, led by chief negotiator Rajesh Agrawal, returned from Washington after a fifth round of talks without a breakthrough.

"An interim deal before August 1 looks difficult, though virtual discussions are ongoing," one of the Indian government sources said, adding a U.S. delegation was expected to visit New Delhi soon to continue negotiations.

Talks are stalled as New Delhi is refusing to open its politically-sensitive agriculture and dairy sectors, while Washington is resisting India's demand for relief from higher tariffs on steel, aluminium and autos.

Officials are exploring if these issues can be deferred

However, this could be temporary, as both countries aim to sign the deal over time," he

U.S. Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent told CNBC on Monday that the Trump administration was more concerned with the quality of trade agreements than their timing.

Asked if the deadline could be extended for countries in talks, he said it was up to Trump.

Indian officials remain hopeful of clinching a broader deal by September or October, in line with what was agreed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Trump in February.

'Given that there have been five rounds of negotiations and another U.S. delegation is expected, we remain optimistic about finalising a trade pact," a third government source said.

The sources requested anonymity as negotiations are not public.

The Indian commerce ministry and the U.S. Trade Representative's Office did not immediately respond to emailed requests for comments.

Analysis: Impact Of Trump Bill's \$250 Fee Addon For Some Foreign Travelers. Start Date Not Yet Announced

or many foreign nationals, a new visa fee will increase the cost of traveling to the United States by

The "visa integrity fee," included in the sweeping policy legislation that President Donald Trump signed into law this month, will require visitors traveling on a nonimmigrant visa to pay an additional \$250. This group includes leisure and business travelers as well as international students from a wide range of countries such as India, China, Mexico, Brazil, South Africa and the Philippines. Applicants must pay this amount on top of other visa fees that often total nearly \$200.

The Department of Homeland Security can adjust the fee based on inflation, starting in October. The bill does not specify when the fee will go into effect.

In a statement, DHS said the new law "provides the necessary policies and resources to restore integrity in our nation's immigration system. The visa integrity fee requires cross-agency coordination before implementa-

The department did not answer questions from The Washington Post about when the fee will be implemented and how visitors will pay it. The State Department did not respond to a request for comment.

The fee could be refundable once the visitor visa ex-

pires, typically in 10 years for business and tourist visas, according to Geoff Freeman, president and CEO of the U.S. Travel Association, a nonprofit that advocates for the travel industry.

The fee does not apply to travelers from more than 40 countries covered by the Visa Waiver Program, such as Australia, Chile, France, Qatar and Singapore. These visitors, however, will also feel a new financial pinch. Under the law, the application fee for the Electronic System for

Travel Authorization will increase from \$21 to \$40.

Freeman said the ESTA fee will be split among a travel promotion fund, Customs and Border Protection, and a general Treasury fund. The visa integrity fee, which he called a "junk fee that would make Ticketmaster blush," will go toward deficit reduction.

"Let's steal money from foreign travelers, money that they would have spent in U.S. restaurants and hotels and with small businesses," Freeman said. "Now they're going to give it to the U.S. government."

The fee could scare off potential visitors, said Steven Brown, an immigration lawyer based in Houston. He said a family of four headed to Disney World on a tourist visa called a B-2, which costs \$185 per person, would have to pay more than \$1,700 before they even set foot in the Magic Kingdom.

"People might question, 'Hey, is this an extra expense we want to pay?'" Brown said.

According to the new law, travelers may receive a refund if they comply with several stipulations, such as leaving within five days of the preapproved departure date and not accepting unauthorized employment. The provision does not provide details on how a traveler would receive a refund. Brown said DHS and the State Department will oversee the refund process.

Freeman doubted that visitors will ever see a check. "The U.S. government is not a bank that's going to be

setting aside people's money and give them interest on that amount when we return it to them in 10 years," he said. "It is a cynical way to create an offset on the backs of foreigners.

The Congressional Budget Office estimates the fee will generate \$28.9 billion through fiscal 2034, though it is not clear whether that projection factors in the yet-to-beannounced implementation date.

The United States is gearing up for two of the world's preeminent athletic events, the FIFA World Cup, which

the U.S. will co-host with Canada and Mexico next summer, and the 2028 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles.

Los Angeles, which will stage the international competition for a third time, holds the record for hosting the most profitable Games in Olympic history, the 1984 Summer Games

The World Cup could be even more lucrative. A Fédération Internationale de Football Association analysis released in March said the country could garner \$6.4 billion in tourist spending.

Tourism forecasts for the FIFA World Cup 2026 are promising," the study noted. "This influx of visitors will likely generate billions of dollars in economic activity, benefiting the hospitality, transportation, and retail sec-

The wildly popular soccer tournament will overlap with America's 250th anniversary, a year-long celebration marking the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

The timing of the visa fee is inopportune, Freeman said. According to the association, international visits declined 3.4 percent in the first half of 2025 compared with last year. The number fell 5 percent in June alone.

Before the pandemic, we had 79 million visitors. Last year, we had 72 million visitors," Freeman said. "This year, we're going backwards.'

Though the majority of visitors originate from visawaiver countries, 45 percent "must go through hurdles to get a visa," Freeman said.
Brand USA, which promotes international travel, also

took a hit, losing \$80 million of its federal funding for the 2026 fiscal year.

Freeman said the association and other travel industry entities plan to push back against the visa integrity fee.

'This is just dumb policy," Freeman said.

State Department To Investigate Harvard's Use Of International **J-1 Visas**

he State Department on Wednesday, July 23, opened a new investigation into Harvard University's eligibility as a sponsor of visas through the Exchange Visitor Program, intensifying the Trump administration's battle with the Ivy League insti-

In a statement, Secretary of State Marco Rubio said all program sponsors need to comply with government regulations and ensure they do not undermine U.S. foreign policy or compromise the country's national security interests.

The American people have the right to expect their universities to uphold national security, comply with the law, and provide safe environments for all students. The investigation will ensure that State Department programs do not run contrary to our nation's interests," the statement said. It did not outline any specific misconduct on Harvard's part.

In an emailed statement Wednesday, Harvard said it remains committed to compliance with all Exchange Visitor Program regulations.

This investigation is yet another retaliatory step taken by the Administration in violation of Harvard's First Amendment rights," a spokesperson said, adding that the university continues to enroll and sponsor international scholars, researchers and students.

The Exchange Visitor Program provides nonimmigrant visas, also known as J-1 visas, for those coming to the United States in various educational and cultural capacities, including as students, professors, au pairs, camp counselors, interns and researchers.

President Donald Trump's targeting of higher education institutions to bring them in line with his political

agenda has involved actions such as freezing of billions of dollars in federal research funding. His administration has tried to revoke Harvard's ability to enroll international students and has focused on visa applications related to the nation's oldest university for additional federal scrutiny.

Harvard has pushed back against the administration's claims, including that it is not taking sufficient action against antisemitism on campus. This week, in a case that could have significant ramifications for higher education in the U.S., Harvard's lawyers argued that the Trump administration's reasons for withholding federal funding were "cooked up" and unconstitutional. The hearing

before U.S. District Judge Allison D. Burroughs concluded without a ruling.

In May, when the Department of Homeland Security revoked Harvard's ability to admit international students, the university sued and won a temporary block of the ban. There are more than 10,000 foreign students and scholars from over 150 countries at Harvard in the current academic year, according to its data.

Days later, the State Department directed its embassies and consulates to undertake extra scrutiny of visa applicants requesting travel to Harvard, including students, faculty, workers, guest speakers and tourists.

Last month, Trump issued a proclamation – which typically does not have the force of law - seeking to restrict the entry of international students and scholars looking to study or research at Harvard. Soon afterward, a court blocked the administration from targeting student visas, following which the State Department instructed consulates to resume processing such applications.

Harvard says it has taken numerous steps to address antisemitism in the wake of campus protests last year over the war in Gaza. Earlier this month, the Harvard Crimson reported that the school told international students to expect enhanced screening at Boston Logan International Airport and warned them that their social media could be vetted for pro-Palestinian posts.

While Harvard's legal fights continue, other institutions have sought to compromise with the administration. Columbia University on Wednesday agreed to pay the federal government more than \$200 million to settle a dispute over funding. The deal reinstates most of the \$400 million in frozen research grants and closes investigations into the school.

What to Do If You Lose Your Job on an H-1B or L-1 Visa: Practical Guidance

career plans, and financial stability are at stake. If you're on an H-1B, L-1, or a similar work visa, here's what you need to know to protect yourself and plan your next steps.

1. The 60-Day Grace Period: Understanding Your Safety Net

When your employment ends, H-1B and L-1 visa holders are generally granted a 60-day grace period. Key facts:

Start Date: The grace period begins the day after your final working day (not the last day of payroll or severance).

During the grace period, you can:

- Secure a new job and have the new employer file a visa transfer, or
- Change your status to another lawful category (such as student or dependent) Important: Being on severance or paid leave does not count as maintaining valid H-1B or L-1 status for immigration purposes.

2. Why You Should Act by Day 45

Transferring to a new employer requires a certified Labor Condition Application (LCA) from the U.S. Department of Labor, which can take up to a week. Delaying the process puts you at risk of overstaying. Tips:

- Begin your H-1B transfer or change of status process by Day 45 of the grace
- If you haven't secured a new position by then, consider applying to change to a visitor (B-2) or another temporary category to avoid falling out of status.

3. Considering Other Visa Types

EB-5 Investor Visa

If you have the financial means, an EB-5 visa (minimum \$800,000 investment in a qualified U.S. project) offers a direct path to a green card without employer sponsorship. You may also qualify for concurrent Adjustment of Status, allowing you to live and work in the U.S. while your case is pending.

F-1 Student Visa

Returning to school is another option, but proceed with caution:

- Avoid programs promoting "Day One CPT"—they are under increased scrutiny.
- Only enroll in reputable, accredited institutions to avoid future immigration complications.

4. Temporary Status Changes

If your spouse holds valid H-1B or L-1 status, you may qualify to switch to a dependent visa (H-4 or L-2). This can give you more time to remain in the U.S. while you look for new employment.

Note: If you later receive a job offer, a new visa petition and possibly consular processing may be required to return to work.

5. Special Considerations for L-1 Visa Holders

The L-1 visa is employer- and position-specific. You generally cannot transfer to a different company unless it's a qualifying affiliate and a new petition is

If no internal transfer is available, your options may be:

- Changing to a different nonimmigrant status
- Departing the U.S. before the grace period ends

6. Green Card (PERM) Sponsorship: What If You're in Process?

If your green card application was tied to your job (through PERM/Labor Certification) and you lose that job, the process typically cannot continue. A new employer will need to start from scratch.

If you're close to the fifth year of H-1B status and anticipating layoffs, speak to an attorney immediately to build a backup strategy.

Britain And India Sign Free Trade Pact During Modi Visit

ritain and India signed a free trade agreement on Thursday during a visit by Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, sealing a deal to cut tariffs on goods from textiles to whisky and cars and allow more market access for businesses.

The two countries concluded talks on the trade pact in May after three years of stop-start negotiations, with both sides hastening efforts to clinch a deal in the shadow of tariff turmoil unleashed by U.S. President Donald Trump.

The agreement between the world's fifth and sixth largest economies aims to increase bilateral trade by a further 25.5 billion pounds (\$34 billion) by 2040.

It is Britain's biggest trade deal since it left the European Union in 2020, although its impact will be a fraction of the effect of leaving the orbit of its closest trading partner.

For India, it represents its biggest strategic partnership with an advanced economy, and one which could provide a template for a long mooted deal with the EU as well as talks with other regions.

It will take effect after a ratification process, likely within a year.

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer said the deal would bring "huge benefits" for both countries, making trade cheaper, quicker and easier.

"We've entered a new global era, and that is one that requires us to step up, not to stand aside... by building deeper partnerships and alliances," Starmer said.

Modi said the visit would "go a long way

in advancing the economic partnership between our nations".

They also agreed a partnership covering areas such as defence and climate, and said they would strengthen co-operation on tackling crime.

WHISKY, CARS

Under the trade agreement, tariffs on Scotch whisky will drop to 75% from 150% immediately, and then slide to 40% over the next decade, according to the British government. On cars, India will cut duties to 10% from over 100% under a quota sys-

tem that will be gradually liberalised.

In return, Indian manufacturers will gain access to the UK market for electric and hybrid vehicles, also under a quota system.

The ministry has said 99% of Indian exports to Britain would benefit from zero duties under the deal, including textiles, while Britain will see reductions on 90% of its tariff lines, with the average tariff UK firms face dropping to 3% from 15%.

While it is Britain's biggest deal since Brexit, the projected boost to British economic output, of 4.8 billion pounds a year by 2040, is small compared to the country's gross domestic product of 2.6 trillion pounds in 2024.

The Office for Budget Responsibility (OBR) has forecast that UK exports and imports will be about 15% lower in the long run compared with if Britain had staved in the EU.

In its first year in power, Britain's Labour government has launched a reset of ties with the EU in order to smooth trade friction, while also clinching some tariff relief from the United States and the India trade deal.

"In an era of rising protectionism, today's announcement sends a powerful signal that the UK is open for business," said Rain Newton-Smith, the chief executive of the Confederation of British Industry.

The India deal will also facilitate easier access for temporary business visitors, though visas are not covered. Britain and India also agreed to ensure workers no longer have to make social security contributions in both India and Britain during temporary postings in the other country.

Under the trade deal, British firms will be able to access India's procurement market for projects in sectors such as clean energy, and it also covers services sectors such as insurance.

India didn't succeed in its efforts to get an exemption from Britain's Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM) – which could levy higher taxes on polluters from 2027 – as part of the deal. Meanwhile talks over a separate bilateral investment treaty are continuing.

Factbox-Key Wins From UK-India Trade Deal – Investments, Jobs, Exports

Here are the key points of the agreement:

TARIFF CUTS

India to reduce tariffs on nearly 90% of UK goods. Whisky and gin levy to fall from 150% to 75%, then to 40% in a decade.

Automobile tariff to fall from 100%-plus to 10% under quota.

Tariffs to be cut on other goods including cosmetics, medical devices, salmon, chocolates, biscuits.

UK to offer duty-free access to 99% of Indian items, according to Indian commerce ministry, covering nearly 100% of trade value.

India's average tariff on UK goods will fall from 15% to 3%.

Key reductions include:

*Aerospace: From 11% to 0%

BENEFITS FOR INDIAN SECTORS

Duty-free access for about 99% of Indian exports could unlock \$23 billion in new opportunities, said Piyush Goyal, India's trade minister.

Indian exports such as textiles, footwear, gems and jewellery, furniture, auto components, chemicals, machinery, sports goods and other items likely to have zero duties, down from current levels of 4%-16% in the UK.

Indian farmers to get access to the UK's \$37.5 billion market.

INVESTMENTS, GDP IMPACT

Nearly £6 billion in investments and export wins announced.

UK GDP projected to rise by £4.8 billion a year. UK consumers to benefit from cheaper Indian gar-

MAJOR BUSINESS WINS

Airbus and Rolls-Royce: Over £5 billion in aircraft contracts with Indian carriers.

Carbon Clean: £7.6 million investment in Mumbai innovation centre.

Zerowatt Energy – £10 million investment to set up a UK head quarters.

SERVICES

UK to allow temporary stay of Indian business visitors and contractual service providers, yoga instructors, chefs and musicians.

The deal will give UK businesses access to India's public procurement market, comprising about 40,000 tenders with a value of about 38 billion pounds a year, according to UK government estimates.

Indian textile and apparel manufacturers such as Welspun India, Arvind Ltd, Raymond, Vardhman likely to benefit from duty-free access for exports to the UK.

UK COMPANIES TO GAIN

UK firms including whisky distiller Diageo, auto manufacturer Aston Martin and Tata-owned Jaguar Land Rover could benefit from access to fast-growing Indian market.

STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP

To ramp up joint efforts against organised crime, illegal migration, and agreement on framework for a criminal records sharing agreement.

Sensitive items such as dairy, apples, and edible oils excluded from tariff cuts.

This summer, we set out to explore a perfect blend of urban culture and natural beauty in the Pacific Northwest gem—Portland, Oregon. Often called the "City of Bridges," Portland is a captivating mix of mountains, markets, microbrews, green trails, and progressive urban living. It was quiet, elegant, and instantly felt like home—an elevated experience that made our trip even more special.




Mount Saint Helens after 1980 eruption

The next morning, we started at the famous best of a kind, vegandedicated Doe Donuts and headed to the tranquil Portland Japanese Garden, nestled in Washington Park's scenic West Hills. Widely regarded as the most authentic Japanese garden outside of Japan, offers a peaceful and meticulously designed escape. Just steps away, we wandered through the Portland International Rose Test Garden, where more than 10,000 rose bushes—representing 600+ varieties—were in full bloom. It was the perfect time of year to visit, and the fragrance, color, and history (including its WWI-era roots) made it a photographer's dream.

We toured the stately Pittock Mansion in the afternoon, a historical icon perched high above the city. The blend of French Renaissance and Victorian design, paired with cutting-edge innovations of the early 1900s, told a fascinating story of Portland's past. That evening, we dined at Mirisata, a vegan Sri Lankan street food restaurant that started as a pop-up. Their spicy pigeon pea fritters and jackfruit-potato croquettes left a flavorful impression.

A peaceful visit to Lan Su Chinese Garden in Old Town Chinatown began next day. This authentic Ming Dynasty—style scholar's garden brought serenity and beauty into the heart of the city. We sipped traditional Chinese tea at Yun Shui Teahouse, housed in the elegant Tower of Cosmic Reflection, enjoying the delicate ambience.

In the afternoon, we took a short drive to Multnomah Falls, Oregon's tallest year-round waterfall and a true Columbia River Gorge icon. On the way, we caught striking views of Mount Hood, another postcard-perfect moment. The legend Multnomah maiden, who gave her life to save her people, added spiritual depth to the natural beauty. The 2.4-mile round-trip hike offered stunning views and peaceful moments, and our final scenic stop at Vista House at Crown Point gave us a panoramic sweep of the Gorge—an unforgettable sight.

Back in the city, we spent the evening in the Pearl District, once the epicentre of Portland's arts scene. We explored galleries, strolled the famed "Brewery Blocks," and immersed ourselves in literary wonder at Powell's City of Books—the world's largest independent bookstore with over a million volumes. A quick loop through the historic West End offered a final taste of Portland's vibrant blend of fashion, creativity, and nightlife.

On our last day, we started at Jam on Hawthorne, a lively, art-filled cafe, with delicious vegan varieties. We visited the Grotto, a peaceful 62-acre sanctuary known as the National Sanctuary of Our Sorrowful Mother. Set atop Rocky Butte, the Grotto features a lower-level shrine carved into volcanic cliffs and an upper-level botanical garden accessible by elevator. Highlights included the Meditation Chapel with panoramic views, a labyrinth, and international shrines nestled among quiet gardens.

Our journey through Portland, Oregon, deepened our appreciation for the region's vibrant mix of nature, culture, and community. From tranquil gardens to urban energy, waterfalls to historic mansions, this city has a soul that stays with you long after the trip ends.

Mukesh-Rafi-Kishore: The Musical Fortnight That Is July 22 To August 4

he Vocal Trinity that RULED Hindi cinema for decades—which by no means is to belittle the remaining legends—Manna Dey, Mahendra Kapoor, Talat Mahmood and Hemant Kumar—seems to have another common point besides their legendary status: this fortnight!

Mukesh was born on July 22 and Kishore Kumar on August 4. In-between, Mohammed Rafi passed away on July 31. Never mind if their years are all different. Let us poignantly recall another common point: they all passed away before time, and while Mohammed Rafi at least was conferred the Padma Shri, the other two did not get any such borner.

More: while Manna Dey was deservingly awarded the Dadasaheb Phalke trophy, the other two, like many others in film music, never won it. As per the official rule, posthumous Phalke recognition is very rare, but even if it is, these giants were never considered for it.

The final common point: Mukesh's and Kishore's idol was K.L. Saigal, but it was Rafi who got to sing the portion Roohi Roohi Roohi in Shahjehan (1946), with Saigal in his last film. Kishore, in the later decades, refused to sing a cover version of Saigal hits, in case his idol's singing was unfavorably compared to his!

One more crucial aspect: As Shahid Rafi, Mohammed Rafi's son, put it, "Everyone who knew my father called him a farishta (angel), but in those times, all the male singers were angels by nature."

BEGINNINGS:

Mukesh: Nirdosh (1941), in which he was also the hero. The music was by Ashok Ghosh.

Mohammed Raffi: Pahele Aap (1944) is considered his first release in Hindi, but his duet with G. M. Durrani, Aji dil ho qaabu mein for Gaon Ki Gori (released only in 1945) was his first Hindi recording under Shyam Sundar. In 1941, a 17 year-old Rafi recorded his first song, a duet with Zeenat Begum, for the Punjabi film Gul Baloch (released in 1944). This was in Lahore and also under the direction of composer, Shyam Sundar.


Kishore Kumar: While he started as a chorus singer in S.D. Burman's Shikari (1946), his debut as a featured singer happened with Khemchand Prakash in Ziddi (1948).

STRUGGLES AND BREAKTHROUGHS:

Mukesh: Mukesh worshipped K.L. Saigal and would imitate his tenor. His first hit was Dil jalta hai to jalne do from Pehli Nazar (1945) under Anil Biswas. Reportedly, Saigal even wondered when he had recorded the song when he heard it! In that sense, his true breakthrough came with Andaz and Barsaat in 1949, especially the latter, where Shankar-Jaikishan extracted him out of the Saigal shell.

Mohammed Rafi: He went from strength to strength with no particular breakthrough, right from the 1940s (Anmol Ghadi, Jugnu, Dulari and more). Rafi was inspired by G.M. Durrani but soon evolved his own style and also became known for singing in the higher octaves. Durrani was an actor-singer then, and his last appearance was lip-synching the Rafi hit Unnke khayal aaye to in the 1972 Lal Patthar.

Kishore Kumar: The Eternal Eccentric would charge a full rupee (in times when a middle-class family could survive comfortably on Rs. 20 a month!) for singing a Saigal song for his brother, Ashok Kumar's friends at parties! Always trying to be an actor, he continued to sing for himself while also recording for Dev Anand frequently in the 1950s (and later too) under S.D. Burman. It is said that he really arrived on the scene with Aradhana as late as in 1969, when Rafi was unavailable abroad, and the composer and filmmaker homed in on Kishore to record three of the five songs of the upcoming hero,

MOST FREQUENT ASSOCIATIONS

Mukesh: Actors Raj Kapoor, Manoj Kumar Composers Shankar-Jaikishan, Kalyanji-Anandji, Laxmikant-Pyarelal and distinguished collaborations with Salil Chowdhury and Roshan Co-singer: Lata Mangeshkar

Mohammed Rafi: Actors Shammi Kapoor, Dilip Kumar, Dharmendra, Johnny Walker, Dev Anand, Rajendra Kumar, Sanjeev Kumar, Shashi Kapoor, Jeetendra, Biswajeet, Joy Mukerji, Bharat Bhushan, Sunil Dutt, Sanjay Khan and distinguished collaborations with Rishi Kapoor, Raaj Kumar and Rajesh Khanna. Kishore Kumar: Actors Dev Anand, Rajesh Khanna, Randhir Kapoor, Rishi Kapoor, Amitabh Bachchan and Kishore himself. Distinguished collaborations with Dharmendra, Jeetendra, Shashi Kapoor and Sanjeev Kumar in later years. Composers S.D. Burman, R.D. Burman, Kalyanji-Anandji, Laxmikant-Pyarelal, Bappi Lahiri & Rajesh Roshan and distinguished collaborations with Shankar-Jaikishan and O.P. Nayyar. Co-singers Asha Bhosle, Lata Mangeshkar, Mohammed Rafi and Manna Dev.

MOONLIGHTING:

Mukesh: He produced two films, Malhar and Anurag in

the 1950s, scoring music for the latter. He acted in a few films.

Mohammed Rafi: He acted as himself in Kala Bazar (1959), but his actual performances came in Laila Majnu and Jugnu in the 1940s.

Kishore Kumar: The greatest all-rounder Hindi cinema has known, Kishore was a top star in the 1950s and early 1960s and also composed music for 10 films, nine of which starred himself. He produced, wrote and directed several films and was also a lyricist in many of his own productions. However, in a special case, he wrote a song (along with Anand Dutta) named Jai Kaali Kalkattewali for Shankar-Jaikishan in Joy Mukerji's Love In Bombay.

CAREER:

Mukesh: Including other languages and nonfilm, is said to have recorded around 1300 songs until his death on October 27, 1976, and yet is ranked among the topmost singing legends of Hindi cinema. His last recording was Chanchal sheetal nirmal komal for Laxmikant-Pyarelal's

sheetal nirmal komal for Laxmikant-Pyarelal's Satyam Shivam Sundaram. After his death, many songs came out, mostly composed by L-P. However, his last two released songs came under Jaidev in the 1997 TV serial, Chand Grahan. They were recorded for a film that was shelved.

Mohammed Rafi: His tally is said to be around 7000. His last recording was for Shaher mein charcha hai (with Lata) for Aas Paas under L-P. After that duet, he sang the four-liner Tere aane ki aas hai dost for the same film. His last film song (recorded again for a shelved film) came out in 1989 and was filmed on Govinda in Farz Ki Jung. Six songs recorded for an incomplete Chitragupta

Six songs recorded for an incomplete Chitragupta composed film were however re-mastered and released in 2009 as his last songs. There were also similar solos for Madan Mohan and Naushad released later. Rafi, incidentally, has sung in the maximum number of languages, including six foreign languages!

kishore Kumar: His last recorded song (a few days before his death on October 13, 1987) was Guru guru in Bappi Lahiri's Waqt Ki Awaz in 1988. Several songs released subsequently until the early 1990s. However, he was heard as late as 2013 in the delayed film, Love In Bombay with music by Shankar-Jaikishan. This was also his last-released film as an actor: he played the lead along with Joy Mukerji. His score is 3000 songs.

THE VOICES THEY INSPIRED:

Mukesh: His son, Nitin Mukesh, had a natural resemblance to his father that could not possibly be jettisoned to prevent being called a clone. Just like his father, he had a very high percentage of hits. Manhar, and Pankaj Udhas also had similar vocal tenors. Later, Dr. Kamlesh Awasthi, Babla Mehta and Nalin Dave sang in similar voices as clones.

Mohammed Rafi: Anwar was the first to sing in a Rafi-like voice and appeared during Rafi's lifetime. Shabbir Kumar, Mohammed Aziz, Sonu Nigam, Debashish Dasgupta, Vipin Sachdeva and Gurcharan. Mahendra Kapoor, Rafi's student (he had tied the ganddaa) also had a somewhat similar vocal quality. Udit Narayan claimed to follow his style. Roopkumar Rathod's singing also echoes Rafi's timber.

Kishore Kumar: Son Amit Kumar, who started out in his father's time, was made to sing in the same mold but always tried to make his own style. Kumar Sanu, Abhijeet and Shaan (to an extent), Sudesh Bhosle (when forced sometimes!), Vinod Rathod and Babul Supriyo also sang like him and Sanu, Rathod and Supriyo had similar voices

And suffice to say that every orchestra and musical group has a 'Rafi', 'Mukesh' or 'Kishore' in it. And these three singers' oeuvre allow them all to earn a great living.


