Festival Of Joy 2025 Transforms Downtown Bloomington, Ill., With Color, Culture, And Community


owntown Bloomington, Illinois, came alive in a kaleidoscope of sights, sounds, and flavors as more than 1,500 attendees gathered on September 7, 2025, at Museum Square for the 15th annual Festival of Joy – Sri Jagannath Ratha Yatra.

From 2:00 PM to 7:00 PM, the streets echoed with music, dance, and devotion, celebrating a 3,000-year-old Indian tradition brought vibrantly to life in the heart of the Midwest.

Organized by the Hare Krishna Community of Bloomington-Normal, inspired by ISKCON (International Society for Krishna Consciousness), the festival blended spirituality, culture, and community into an unforgettable experience of unity and joy.

The centerpiece of the festival, the Ratha Yatra Chariot Parade, drew inspiration from the legendary street festival of Jagannath Puri in India. Bloomington's Main Street was transformed into a spiritual procession, with a flower-adorned chariot carrying the deities of Lord Jagannath, Balaram, and Subhadra. Accompanied by the beats of clay drums, cymbals, and chanting, the parade united children, elders, and families in a moving celebration of devotion.

The festival opened with a warm welcome from emcees Surabhi and Vikhyath, followed by community leaders including Bloomington Mayor Dan Brady, Police Chief Jamal Simington, and His Holiness Romapada Swami. Mayor Brady symbolically swept the streets in an act of humility, honoring the ancient customs of Ratha Yatra. Chief Simington highlighted the city's commitment to public safety and community partnerships, while Romapada Swami

delivered an inspiring keynote on the spiritual significance of the celebra-

The community also honored Mandava Venkateswara Rao and Manasa Rao for decades of dedicated service to Bloomington-Normal.

Throughout the afternoon, Museum Square was alive with interactive cultural activities: henna artistry, sari and turban draping, arts and crafts, yoga sessions, and the "Check Your Spiritual Quotient" booth. The Taste of India food court delighted visitors with authentic vegetarian cuisine, while a free dinner service provided more than 900 complimentary meal boxes.

Colorful performances on stage included dances by the Bhakti Kids, traditional devotional dramas, and a Bharatanatyam and Carnatic vocal recital by Sita Vakkalanka. Classical dances, mridanga drumming, and a closing kirtan brought the crowd into collective mantra meditation.

The festival's success was made possible with the support of partners including Sewa International, whose volunteers have served refreshments at the event for over a decade, along with contributions from local institutions such as the McLean County Museum of History, Visit BN, and area businesses.

Since its modest beginnings in 2010, the Festival of Joy has blossomed into one of Bloomington's most anticipated cultural celebrations. Its move downtown in 2023, backed by Mayor Mboka Mwilambwe, expanded its reach and diversity, drawing visitors from across Illinois and beyond.

As festival co-organizer Prakash Chincholikar reflected, "We have a lot more in common than what divides us." Fellow organizer Poorvi Shah added, "Make sure you participate that's when you truly feel the joy."

Indian American Named The First-Ever President Of PETA International

ndian American Poorva Joshipura, a member of the board of directors of People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals-India, PETA India, has been named the first-ever President of PETA International.

Joshipura, who is the author of For a Moment of Taste: How What You Eat Impacts Animals, the Planet, and Your Health—was brought up in Suffolk, Virginia. Her book was the first-ever in-depth exposé of how animals commonly used for meat, eggs, and dairy are treated in India.

Now, as the first-ever president of PETA International, Joshipura will be overseeing its projects and operations in Europe, Asia, and parts of the Middle East.

After starting her career at PETA's headquarters in Norfolk, Virginia, Joshipura has championing the cause of animals for more than 25 years in countries world-wide through provocative protests, undercover investigations, and strategic work with corporate and government leaders.

"Years ago, in a slaughterhouse where I was recording how badly cows are killed for leather, I locked eyes with a frightened calf who was pinned to the ground, aware of his pending death, and at that moment vowed to dedicate my life to animal liberation," Joshipura is quoted saying in a press release September 10, 2025.. "For more than 25 years with PETA entities, from undercover investigator to leading international campaigns, I've been true to that pledge."

Born in Philadelphia to parents from Gujarat, India, Joshipura was raised in Suffolk and graduated magna cum laude from Old Dominion University with a degree in psychology.

She joined PETA as an intern in its Norfolk office in 1999. Her more "public-facing" work, as PETA calls it, includes being jailed for disrupting a New York fashion show in protest of Michael Kors' use of fur (which he later banned); burned in effigy by an angry mob after she helped achieve an Indian Supreme Court ban on the use of bulls for entertainment; and "caged" in Nairobi to

highlight the plight of chickens killed for food.

As president, Joshipura's priorities include using technology and scientific innovation to eliminate animal exploitation, including replacing elephants allegedly chained in Asian temples with mechanical ones, and using animatronic animals to help educate and encourage children's natural empathy toward animals, PETA noted in its press release. She also aims to educate the public about what PETA says, is "the inextricable link between animal exploitation and pandemics, antibiotic resistance, and the climate catastrophe."

"I'm deeply honored to help shape the global future of animal liberation and put compassion on every map in my new role," Joshipura said. "I will seek to harness technological solutions for animal protection, apply cultural intelligence to advance liberation, and promote the unshakable truth that how we treat animals defines us."

PETA counts among Joshipura's achievements — convincing Mercedes-Benz to be the first automobile retailer to offer leather-free interiors by special order; stopping a US-based laboratory-animal supplier from setting up a facility in Europe; leading successful efforts to ban testing cosmetics and their ingredients on animals in India; and ending the use of horse-drawn carriages in Petra and Mumbai. She is also the author of Survival at Stake: How Our Treatment of Animals Is Key to Human Existence.

"Poorva has been an unstoppable force in the animal liberation movement," says PETA Founder Ingrid Newkirk. "Her extraordinary drive and determination are invaluable in extending our vital efforts to help animals everywhere."

TIME Magazine Names Indian American 2025 Kid Of The Year

Very common, it turns out...Within the year she had built and launched Shield Seniors, a website and, soon, mobile app, designed to educate the 60-plus demographic about what online scams look like, analyze suspicious emails and messages

users upload, and, if the communications prove fraudulent, provide links to report them."

Commentary: PM Modi's 'Next-Gen' GST: A New Dawn For **India's Economy**

n a decisive and visionary move, our government under Prime Minister Narendra Modi has delivered on its promise of a "double Diwali" for the nation with the landmark approval of Next-Generation GST reforms. This sweeping overhaul, which simplifies India's tax system into a modern two-tiered structure, is a testament to the Prime Minister's steadfast commitment to citizen welfare and economic growth. Far more than a technical adjustment, these reforms represent a bold reset of India's fiscal architecture, one that is politically astute, economically potent, and socially inclusive. Industry bodies such as the Confederation of Indian Industry have hailed this move as a visionary step that empowers businesses while directly benefiting consumers through a simpler, transparent, and growth-oriented tax regime. Citizens will feel the impact in their household budgets, while businesses will gain from predictability and reduced compliance burdens.

The idea of GST itself has a long history. It was first proposed by Atal Bihari Vajpayee's NDA government in 2000 when an empowered committee of state finance ministers was established to reform the sales tax regime. But the reform languished for years without serious follow-through. It was only with Prime Minister Modi's conviction and consensus-building approach that the dream of "One Nation, One Tax" finally turned into reality. Within two years of being tabled in Parliament in 2014, the GST-related 101st Constitutional Amendment was passed and ratified by the states, paving the way for the midnight launch of GST on July 1, 2017. This reform stitched together India's fragmented indirect tax system, subsuming more than 17 taxes and 13 cesses into a single system. It eliminated the cascading tax-on-tax effect, eased interstate trade, and created a unified national market, fulfilling Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's dream of building an economically integrated India.

By its 8th anniversary on July 1, 2025, GST had proven its worth. India's taxpayer base expanded from 66.5 lakh in 2017 to 1.51 crore in 2025. Revenues doubled in just four years, touching Rs. 22.08 lakh crore in FY 2024-25, with an average monthly collection of over Rs. 2 lakh crore compared to just Rs. 82,000 crore in 2017-18. Compliance improved, evasion dropped, and MSMEs found formalization easier. A Deloitte survey revealed that 85 percent of respondents, including small enterprises, expressed satisfaction with GST, marking it as one of the most widely accepted structural reforms of the last

The recent reform marks the most ambitious rationalization since its introduction. At the 56th GST Council meeting, a historic consensus was reached to collapse the complex multi-slab structure into just two principal rates: 5 percent for essentials and 18 percent as the standard rate. Certain necessities have been exempted entirely while a special 40 percent rate will continue for sin and super-luxury goods. This new structure will be implemented from 22nd September 2025 and is nothing less than a re-engineering of the Indian tax system. Nearly 99 percent of items previously under the 12 percent slab are moving to 5 percent, and about 90 percent of goods taxed at 28 percent will now fall under 18 percent. This reform is not tinkering at the margins but a wholesale simplification that aligns India's tax regime with global best practices, ensuring long-term stability, predictability, and direct relief to citizens.

The timing is as significant as the substance. India today faces global trade headwinds ranging from volatile oil markets to tariff wars. Instead of retreating, the government has leaned into India's biggest strength, its



robust domestic consumption engine which makes up 61 percent of GDP. The GST cuts are designed as a consumption-led booster shot to increase household disposable income, drive demand, and cushion external shocks. Rolling out just ahead of the festive season is deliberate and strategic, ensuring immediate benefits to consumers and stimulating spending during India's peak demand cycle. The virtuous cycle that follows-higher consumption leading to higher production, larger tax base, and stronger revenues—will sustain the broader growth story.

Economic projections validate this optimism. NITI Aayog, along with independent institutions such as EY, Standard Chartered, and HSBC, places India's GDP growth this fiscal at 6.5 percent, consistent with government targets. The incremental impact of GST reforms, while modest in percentage points, is highly directional and underpins medium-term stability. The inflation impact is equally critical. With GST reduced on nearly 300 essential items, the State Bank of India projects headline CPI inflation will moderate by 25 to 30 basis points this year, with further relief of 40 to 45 basis points from rationalization of services. Together, this means inflation easing by 65 to 75 basis points over two years, a substantial relief for citizens that translates into more affordable

For households, the relief is visible and immediate. A wide array of daily-use essentials has shifted to the 5 percent slab or nil rate. Soaps, toothpaste, hair oil, shampoos, and shaving products are now cheaper. Packaged food like namkeens, biscuits, chocolates, jams, pickles, juices, and coffee have all dropped in rate, as ĥave kitchen staples like butter, ghee, cheese, sugar, and dry fruits. Educational supplies such as exercise books, pencils, crayons, erasers, maps, and atlases have been brought to zero tax, making education more affordable for families. For the aspirational middle class, consumer durables such as air conditioners, refrigerators, dishwashers, and large TVs have shifted from 28 percent to 18 percent, while services like hotels, gyms, salons, and yoga sessions are now at 5 percent, boosting both affordability and sectors like hospitality and wellness.

Sectors across the economy have been targeted with precision. Farmers benefit directly with tractors, harvesters, and irrigation equipment all moved down to 5 percent, reducing their input costs and stabilizing food prices. Medicines and life-saving drugs for cancer and rare diseases are now fully exempt, while all other medicines including Ayurveda, Unani, and Siddha are taxed at just 5 percent. Diagnostic kits, thermometers, and essential medical devices have also seen major reductions. For households, health and life insurance premiums have been exempted entirely, advancing the government's long-term vision of Mission Insurance for All by 2047. Automobiles are another big winner, with two-wheelers up to 350cc and small cars now taxed at 18 percent instead of 28 percent. Three-wheelers, passenger vehicles, and auto components have all seen similar reductions, providing a much-needed push to both domestic demand and exports.

MSMEs, textiles, and handicrafts stand to gain immensely. Labour-intensive sectors like man-made fibres and artisan goods see duty corrections and lower rates, improving competitiveness and preserving rural livelihoods. Renewable energy adoption too will accelerate as solar heaters, cookers, bamboo flooring, and eco-friendly building materials now fall under the 5 percent slab, aligning fiscal incentives with India's COP climate commitments. Construction inputs like cement have been cut from 28 percent to 18 percent, reducing costs for housing and infrastructure, while materials like granite, particle boards, and wooden pallets have also seen reductions, easing the burden on small builders and the construction industry.

The reform is not just about rate cuts but about fixing long-standing structural issues. Inverted duty structures, which trapped working capital and hurt MSMEs, are being corrected. A new technology-driven GST registration scheme ensures approval within three days for 96 percent of low-risk applicants, cutting red tape for small businesses and startups. Exporters, who previously faced months-long delays in receiving refunds, will now be reimbursed within seven days under a new enhanced mechanism. The introduction of E-Way Bill 2.0 with real-time synchronization guarantees zero downtime for logistics operators, strengthening India's digital backbone for trade and transport.

Politically, the reforms showcase the Modi government's ability to build consensus. Despite diverse political and fiscal interests, the GST Council unanimously backed the new framework, a true reflection of cooperative federalism in action. Economically, it demonstrates the maturity of India's institutions to create a predictable, simple, and globally competitive tax system. Socially, it underscores the government's faith in people-led growth, where every rupee saved in household budgets can fuel national prosperity.

From Vajpayee ji's pioneering idea in 2000 to Prime Minister Modi's historic rollout in 2017 and now this bold rationalization in 2025, GST embodies India's journey of economic integration. It is the story of moving from a fragmented tax system to a unified and modern regime aligned with the dream of Viksit Bharat, a developed India. The Next-Gen GST is not just about simplifying tax rates, it is about reducing household burdens, spurring industry, encouraging MSMEs, empowering farmers, and making healthcare affordable. It is about stability, predictability, and fairness in taxation. Above all, it is about building a nation where growth and prosperity are shared by all citizens.

These reforms will be remembered as a landmark in India's economic journey. They consolidate eight years of progress, double down on citizen welfare, and set the foundation for a stronger, more resilient economy. By simplifying processes, reducing compliance burdens,

and easing the cost of living, the Modi government has once again placed the common man at the heart of reform. The Next-Gen GST is not merely a fiscal reset but a historic step that will leave behind a lasting legacy of affordability, inclusivity, and prosperity for generations to

FDA Official Vinay Prasad Regains Chief Medical Officer Title

op Food and Drug Administration regulator Vinay Prasad has regained his role as the agency's chief medical and scientific officer after he abruptly departed and then came back to the agency, according to an update on the agency's website Thursday, September 11, 2025.

Prasad returned as the agency's top regulator for vaccines and gene therapies as head of the Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research on Aug. 9. The additional chief medical officer role expands his influence and includes representing the agency's perspective on medical and scientific matters. The position is also listed as having a leadership role in choosing which companies will benefit from a program to accelerate some drug reviews if they align with the agency's priori-

ties

Department of Health and Human Services spokesperson Rich Danker confirmed that Prasad had resumed his position as chief medical and scientific officer.

Prasad unexpectedly left the agency on July 29 after a conservative backlash in part over his handling of safety issues with Sarepta Therapeutics Inc.'s gene therapy. Laura Loomer, an ally of President Donald Trump, had said he was not aligned with the president's agenda and aggressively lobbied against his return.

Though Prasad was in his role for less than three months before his ouster, he managed to stir controversy at the agency. He demanded more studies of Covid vaccines, overruled his own scientific review staff and took a confrontational approach that gave critics fodder to claim he could stymie scientific innovation.





Rep. Ami Bera Denounces Medicaid Cuts; Lauds Work Of Planned Parenthood

ongressman Dr. Ami Bera, D-California, on September 9, 2025, joined fellow members of the Democratic Doctors Caucus and Planned Parenthood Federation of America President and CEO Alexis McGill Johnson, to warn against cuts to Medicaid, describing them as having a "devastating" impact on access to affordable, high-quality care provided by Planned Parenthood health centers across the country.

"Since President Trump's "Big, Beautiful Bill" was signed into law, its provision blocking Medicaid patients from receiving care at Planned Parenthood has been temporarily halted by the courts. If reinstated, the provision could force up to 200 health centers to close, putting the health care of 1.1 million Medicaid patients at risk, the press release from Bera's office said.

"What Planned Parenthood does is so much more than just reproductive health care. They're a leader there in reproductive health care. But in many communities across this country, they're the sole provider of

primary care services to women and men," Representa-

tive Bera is quoted saying in the press release.

Lawmakers noted that for many individuals in rural and underserved areas, Planned Parenthood centers are often the only accessible source of care for people in rural and underserved areas for critical primary and preventive care services, such as cancer screenings, STI testing and treatment, chronic disease management, and general wellness visits.

"And what Donald Trump's bill — the big, ugly bill that House Republicans passed — does is it takes away that primary service, those community health center services, from so many Americans, particularly Americans in rural Aerica," Bera added.

At an open press conference on Capitol Hill, Dr. Bera was accompanied by several Democratic doctors as well as the CEO of Planned Parenthood. He was there he said, "Cause we're going to fight. We're going to fight every day. And don't mess with Planned Parenthood — that's why I got my boxing glove on here."

Bera went on to praise Planned Parenthood for doing more than just providing reproductive health care services, but rather it was the sole provider of primary health care services in many communities around the buntry.



Narendra Modi At 75: A Statesman Bridging India With The World

s Prime Minister Narendra Modi turns 75 on September 17, 2025, it marks more than a personal milestone. It offers a moment to reflect on how one of the most consequential leaders of the 21st century has shaped India's journey and

Born in Vadnagar, Gujarat, Modi's rise—from a modest childhood to becoming India's longest-serving prime minister in recent decades—is a story of grit, vision, and unrelenting drive. Over the past decade, he has redefined India's engagement with its diaspora and elevated its voice on the world stage in ways few leaders before him have managed.

STRENGTHENING THE DIASPORA BOND

GLOBAL RECOGNITION AND DIPLOMACY

Parallel to this people-centric approach has been Modi's transformation into one of the world's most decorated leaders. In 2025 alone, he became the first Indian to receive Mauritius's highest civilian honor, the Grand Commander of the Order of the Star and Key of the Indian Ocean. He was awarded Cyprus's Grand Cross of the Order of Makarios III. These joined a growing list of honours from nations as varied as Egypt, Saudi Arabia, the UAE, and Dominica—signals that the world now views India as both a rising power and a responsible partner.

But Modi's diplomacy is not about accolades. It is strategic and forward-looking. His historic visit to Cyprus—the first by an Indian prime minister—paved the way for cooperation in energy and technology. In London, a landmark trade deal with Prime Minister Keir Starmer promised to expand markets for Indian textiles and automobiles while deepening collaboration in services and innovation. Across the Indo-Pacific, Modi has carefully positioned India as a stabilizing force amid shifting geopolitical currents.

TECHNOLOGY AND INNOVATION AS DIPLOMACY

Under Modi, India's technological achievements have become a key instrument of soft power. National Space Day has highlighted India's milestones in lunar and interplanetary exploration, advanced propulsion systems, and semiconductor development. Meanwhile, India's Unified Payments Interface (UPI) has found adoption in countries like Mauritius and Trinidad & Tobago—an example of Indian innovation shaping global financial systems.

A PHILOSOPHY OF GLOBAL SOLIDARITY

Perhaps most enduring has been Modi's emphasis on compassion and global solidarity. For the international community, his leadership has made India a trusted partner, a mediator in turbulent times, and a visionary for a more equitable global order.

This milestone is not just about one man's life. It is the story of a nation's ascent under a leader who built bridges: between India and its diaspora, the Global South and developed world, tradition and modernity, aspiration and achievement.



At 75, Narendra Modi stands as both a symbol of India's journey and a steward of its future—embodying the confidence of a country determined to shape, not just witness, the course of world affairs.

How Employers Can Prepare for a USCIS Site Visit

Ludka Zimovcak Michael Phulwani David Nachman U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) has increased its focus on employer compliance, and one of the most visible tools is the unannounced site visit. These inspections are conducted by officers from the Fraud Detection and National Security (FDNS) directorate and are designed to confirm that the details in immigration petitions match what is happening in the workplace.

With the expansion of compliance programs and the implementation of the H-1B Modernization Rule in 2025, employers should expect more frequent and detailed site inspections. For companies that employ foreign nationals, being prepared is not optional - it is essential.

Why Site Visits Happen

USCIS conducts site inspections to:

- · Verify that employees are working in the roles, locations, and conditions described in their petitions.
- Confirm that the employer is a legitimate, functioning business.
- Detect possible fraud or misrepresentation.
- Ensure compliance with wage and work location requirements, including remote and hybrid arrangements.

In some cases, site visits are random. In others, they are triggered by data analysis, complaints, or specific risk factors.

What to Expect During a Site Visit

FDNS officers may arrive without notice. Once on-site, they typically:

- Review immigration petitions and supporting documentation.
- Ask to see I-9 records.
- · Interview HR staff, managers, and the sponsored employee.
- · Visit workstations and take photographs of the premises.
- Confirm wage and job duty information.

These visits may also extend to third-party client sites if the employee is placed offsite.

Steps to Take Before a Site Visit

Preparation should begin long before an officer arrives:

- 1. Keep records current: Ensure that all immigration files, including job descriptions, wage documentation, and worksite addresses, are accurate and accessible.
- 2. Train reception and staff: Front-desk employees should know how to politely greet officers, verify identification, and immediately notify the appropriate internal contact.
- 3. Designate a point of contact: Employers should have a clear chain of responsibility, with a primary and backup contact for site visits.
- 4. Coordinate with counsel: Have a protocol in place to notify your immigration attorney as soon as a visit begins. Legal counsel can guide you on how to respond to requests during the inspection.

What to Do During the Visit

Stay calm and cooperative: Professionalism goes a long way in minimizing disruption.

- Engage the right staff: Only designated personnel should interact with officers regarding immigration matters.
- Take notes: Document the officer's name, contact information, the questions asked, and any documents or photos requested. Share these notes with counsel immediately after the visit.

Shanker Krishnan's Debut Album, A Fusion Of Carnatic And Western Classical Music

uxtaposing Indian classical Raga and Western classical Counterpoint, composer Shanker Krishnan's upcoming debut album, "Confluence:Raga and Counterpoint" creates a harmonious musical experience.

Releasing September 26, 2025 on the largest Indian arts platform, "IndianRaga" label, the Confluence: Raga and Counterpoint (the Confluence hereafter) comprises of the multi-movement works of Fugue-Kriti and Concerto-Kriti. The album explores the integration of Counterpoint with Carnatic music.

Composed by Krishnan, the Confluence contains solo performances by Shraddha Ravindran on violin, K.R.Shrievats on veena, R.Thiagarajan on flute and Mannarkoil J. Balaji on mridangam.

Oxford Encyclopedia of Music describes Kriti in Carnatic music as a devotional musical composition with a three-part structure of pallavi, anupallavi and charanams.

Fugue is a complex contrapuntal composition usually involving two or more independent melodies, each with its own distinct rhythm and contour while interacting harmonically.

A concerto is a composition for a solo instrument or a small group of solo instruments accompanied by a full orchestra.

WHAT INSPIRED THE CONFLUENCE?

Speaking to News India Times in an exclusive interview, Krishnan said he had wanted to pursue integrating Carnatic and Western classical music at a deep structural level from the time he first heard Western classical music in 1982. Especially as the combination of complex Counterpoint with Carnatic music has not been similarly explored, he added.

"For me, the complexity of Bach's Counterpoint evokes the same response I feel when I hear the intricate Gamakas of T. Brinda," he said. "I've explored other traditions along the way, but Carnatic and Western classical have been closest to me throughout my life," Krishnan said.

EARLY EXPOSURE AND INFLUENCE OF CARNATIC MUSIC


Krishnan and his family lived near the Shan-mukhananda Sabha and the Bharatiya Music & Arts Society, which were major centers of Carnatic music in Mumbai and Krishnan often attended vocal performances there with his family, he said.

At home, his sister Geetha Raja had become a professional Carnatic musician and his parents were deeply involved in it. There were regular family Carnatic music concerts at home, which were recorded on a tape recorder and he kept listening to his favorite musicians, Krishnan said.

Of the Carnatic singers, two have left lasting impressions on Krishnan, influencing him deeply. Krishnan had been listening from childhood to T.Brinda, known as Brindamma, and loved her "subtle gamakas," he said. He was also influenced by the kirtans for Vitthala by the fifteenth century saint-composer Purandara Dasa. The Kriti form in which Krishnan composes descends from the kirtana developed by Purandara Dasa, he said.

INTRODUCTION TO WESTERN CLASSICAL MUSIC

After getting his undergrad degree in engineering from IIT Madras in 1982, Krishnan came to UC Berkeley for a master's in applied math, taking Western classical music courses along with math. Krishnan also has an MBA and a master's in development economics from

Stanford.


It was at Berkeley that Krishnan first heard Hungarian composer and pianist Bartók and French composer Claude Debussy who was the founder and leading exponent of musical impressionism. "The piano was very important – I learned it for many years to absorb lessons in harmony, and as a tool for composition," he said.

The Confluence explores the Baroque era Counterpoint, which is described by Oxford Music as characterized by the simultaneous melodic interaction and interplay of two or more independent, yet harmonically interdependent melodic lines, often expressed through complex forms including the fugue.

From the most prominent Baroque musicians and composers including Johann Sebastian Bach, George Frideric Handel, and Antonio Vivaldi, Krishnan has been influenced the most by Bach whose fugues perfected the counterpoints.

THEMES AND COMPOSITION OF THE CONFLUENCE

Both Carnatic music and Baroque Counterpoint,

although very different cultural and musical traditions, are forms of worship. The Confluence has been created from influences of these two different forms.

Much of the music in the Confluence is based on the Bhagwad Gita, on themes of time, war, victory, righteousness and non attachment.

The Confluence features a Concerto-Kriti – the Field of Dharma, a Pallavi movement – Arjun's lament, an Anupallavi movement – the Field of Battle, a Charanam movement – the Dilemma, and a Swaram movement – the Realization.

A Concerto is a composition for a solo instrument or a small group of solo instruments accompanied by a full orchestra, according to Oxford Music.

Krishnan described the first three movements of Field of Dharma follow Arjuna's emotional struggle and his dilemma over the right path. The fourth movement draws on key teachings including unattachment to results of action.

DEEP EMOTIONS

The emotional depths are conveyed through Krishnan's use of Phrasing and notes and Gamakas which are described in Oxford Music as microtonal embellishments between notes adding depth and expressiveness to them.

Gamakas are at the heart of Carnatic music, Krishnan said. He said he has brought subtlety in shifting moods by changing Harmonic Progressions and Counterpoint. "Varying the instrumentation in the Concerto-Kriti brings in entirely new colors," he said.

AN INTEGRATED FUSION

"For me, the integration is architectural, built from within both (Indian classical and Western classical) traditions, drawing on my long training in each," Krishnan explained. "For each Phrase that I compose, I keep moving between the two systems," he said.

Krishnan said his pieces are driven by a single, unified compositional vision. Towards this end, Krishnan has made use of both the Fugue and the Kriti. "Using them together provides a gateway for listeners from either tradition without having to know the technical details," he said.

INSTRUMENTS IN THE CONFLUENCE

"From the Carnatic tradition, I've chosen the instruments most common in concert performance: the flute, violin, and veena — spanning high to low registers. For percussion, I used the mridangam, with its wide array of expressive tones," he said.

Krishnan has focused on the trumpet and the harp, and to a lesser extent the oboe and cello for the solo Western instruments, he said. Together, they offer a broad range of timbres and sonic colors that contrast and blend with the Carnatic instruments, he added.

FUTURE PLANS

Krishnan had been an investment banker at Morgan Stanley, and an economist at the World Bank. Then he was the deputy treasurer at the IFC, the World Bank's private sector arm, setting up treasury functions and launching new financial products to fund areas like microfinance, infrastructure, and education.

Krishnan has devoted the past fifteen years to study music composition and creating the album. He continues to follow his passion. "My hope is to showcase the richness of Indian music and culture," Krishnan said.

'It's not weird': The people who love to stare at airplane flight maps

Nicole Sunderland doesn't have to ponder the in-flight entertainment "You just gonna sit there staring at the back of the seat?" Elaine Benes asks options when she looks at the screen on the plane seat in front of her. her on-again, off-again boyfriend David Puddy in an oft-referenced episode

She'll be watching the map, thank you very much.

"I'll fly to Qatar for 14 hours and that map will be on the entire time," said Sunderland, 41, a content creator and consultant who splits time between the D.C. area and Phoenix. Flight attendants don't always understand: "Sometimes they'll reach in and be like, 'Do you want us to turn it off?' And I'm like, 'No, no. Leave it on.'"

She's part of a robust group of fliers who keep their eyes on the plane's progress. The practice got a blast of publicity last year amid a social media trend that featured travelers - mostly men - staring straight ahead at maps or blank space during long trips to prove ... something.

her on-again, off-again boyfriend David Puddy in an oft-referenced episode of "Seinfeld." "Yeah," he replies, staring blankly ahead with a satisfied look on his face. The name of the trend is too crude to spell out in a family newspaper (think: uncooked canine). In some cases, according to news articles that questioned whether participants were "heroic or foolish," travelers shunned drinking water or even bathroom visits. Some commenters hailed the "ultimate dopamine detox" while fliers bragged about reaching a new personal best. Whether it was a true endurance challenge or a merely a bit, the internet had a blast with it. "The mind is capable of amazing things," the text over one apparently tongue-in-cheek TikTok says. "My mind knows no limits. I am operating in a different spiritual realm.

'Raving map fans'

Moving in-flight maps, which first appeared on passenger planes in the 1980s, boast broad appeal beyond the brief trend.

According to FlightPath3D, an in-flight map provider for more than 90 airlines, about 68 percent of passengers open the map on seat-back screens and 20 percent view only the map. Delta Air Lines has said the flight map is the top piece of content, with 45 percent of passengers engaging with it during flights.

Duncan Jackson, president of FlightPath3D, has a name for the fans: flight pathers. He said there are now options built in to explore animated previews of destinations, global route maps and animal-filled kids' maps. Last year, he said, 400 million passengers used the product.

"There's comfort in it. For some, it's almost meditative," he said. "They just love to see where they are, how long's left, watch the progress of the aircraft across the flight plan. There are just raving map fans."

Sunderland's interest obsession even - in pinpointing her location in



the sky dates back to a turbulent flight between the Bahamas and Florida in 2017. Now, she keeps her eye on the elevation to see how much the plane has dropped in shaky air. She will try to sleep on an overnight, pick up a book and may occasionally watch her comfort movie, "Crazy Rich Asians." But her eyes return to the map whenever there are bumps.

"All my travel companions make fun of me, every single one," she said.

She once took a long flight with a friend who watched four or five Harry Potter movies in a row.

"My anxious self ... I was watching the speed, the elevation, the flight path," said Sunderland.

Cheaper than buying WiFi

Manu Seminara said watching maps on a plane is "almost like a hobby." The London resident works for a marketing agency and posts travel content on TikTok, where she shared a video of people around her watching movies and TV shows on a plane while she adjusted her view of the map.

"I try to put on a movie and I'm like, "This is more interesting," she said.

She loves seeing the elevation and what city she's flying over.

Seminara said she felt "seen, honestly" when flight map fixations went viral last year.

"I was doing this, and it's not weird, because clearly people are doing it," she said. "They're just coming out now."

Nick Kosir, who is known as the Dancing Weatherman on Fox Weather, was talking to his manager about a recent flight a couple years back.

"It was awesome: I just sat there, stared straight ahead and didn't do anything for five hours," said Kosir, who lives in New York City. "He goes, 'Dude, that's a serial killer trait.'"

When the trend started to go viral the following year, he sent an example to his manager and said "I found my people."

Kosir made his own video showing himself watching the flight map.

He said he spends so much time online every day that he welcomes an escape. Sometimes he just tries to focus on creative ideas or deep thinking before the plane lands. On the flight he put on TikTok, he wrote he counted to 1 million twice.

"On a plane, I'm too cheap to buy the WiFi so it actually is peaceful in my mind and I truly enjoy that," he said. "If there's nothing in front of me, I just stare blankly into the cosmos."

But if the flight map is available, he's a fan.

"I weirdly like watching the flight tracker just because it's cool to me; it's cool to see how fast the plane is going, it's cool to see what state you're over," he said. "Something about it is oddly comforting."

Arundhati Roy Recalls Her Brilliant Mother, Both Teacher And Tyrant

Mother Mary Comes to Me. By Arundhati Roy. Scribner. 330 pp. \$30

or as long as the Indian novelist, Booker Prize winner and activist Arundhati Roy can remember, her mother was – or pretended to be – dying. A chronic asthmatic with a flair for drama, Mary Roy kept her children in line by warning them that any misbehavior on their part might trigger a fatal attack. "Anything I said those days ended in a storm of insults and anger. And asthma. And blame about being the cause of Mrs. Roy's impending death," Arundhati Roy recalls in her new memoir, "Mother Mary Comes to Me." "As a consequence, I had more or less stopped talking." She needn't have done so. Mary never actually died, of course, at least until she did.

And when she finally passed, in 2022, the cause was not her daughter's insolence or obstinance but only her own advanced age.

Even in death, her eccentricities and moods loom large. As Roy puts it mournfully, she remains "taller in my mind than any billboard." When she was alive, she was on the verge of expiring; now that she is dead, she is more inescapably present than ever before. It is a contradiction worthy of a woman who played so many sharply conflicting parts throughout her eventful life.

In the small Syrian Christian community where Roy spent much of her childhood, she watched her mother "unleash all of herself – her genius, her eccentricity, her radical kindness, her militant courage, her ruthlessness, her generosity, her cruelty, her bullying, her head for business, and her wild, unpredictable temper." She founded a famed coeducational school and fought for equal rights for Syrian Christian women - yet she blasted her daughter for promiscuity in decidedly sexist terms. She was gentle and patient with her pupils – yet she was sharp and sometimes violent with her own children. On one occasion, she beat Roy's brother viciously because his report card deemed him an "average stu-

dent"; on another, she shot Roy's dog, who had transgressed by mating with a mutt on the street. Even when she was not outright abusive, she could be cold and unfeeling. To avoid the appearance of favoritism, she instructed her children to call her "Mrs. Roy," just as her students did. "To me," Roy writes, "she still is more Mrs. Roy than mother."

But if Mrs. Roy is the reason her daughter became a lifelong "vagrant," as Roy puts it, she is also the reason her dreamy child would grow up to become the first Indian citizen to win the Booker Prize. Mrs. Roy is the one who introduced her daughter to "Shakespeare, Kipling, and A.A. Milne" and gifted her a typewriter. In a culture in which most women dared aspire to nothing more than a suitable marriage, Mrs. Roy was bent on assuring her rebellious daughter "that if she put her

mind to it, she could be anything she wanted to be.'

Roy took this lesson to heart - so much so that she moved to Delhi, three days' travel from her small village, to pursue a degree in architecture at the age of 16 and stopped coming home, even for vacations, two years later. Throughout her chaotic and bohemian youth, she worked odd jobs, took even odder drugs and lived, among other places, in a storeroom in a studio at the architecture school. After several missteps and many bouts of demoralizing poverty, she found her footing as an actress, a screenwriter and, finally, a novelist.

The international success of her 1997 debut, "The God of Small Things," freed her to turn her attention to politics, and for the past several decades she has devoted herself to writing barn-burning commentary and staging protests against Narendra Modi's far-right regime. "Mother Mary Comes to Me" often feels like two books sutured together: a tender and ambivalent memoir about the difficult Mrs. Roy and a withering polemic about India's political ills.

Roy is disdainful of those who suggest there is any

tension between these two projects. "I was soon being called a writer-activist, a term I found absurd because it suggested that writing about things that vitally affected people's lives was not the remit of a writer," she writes. It is true that writing is generally about people, and it is true that people are political beasts. But perhaps the commenters who label Roy a "writer-activist" are not objecting to her choice of political topics, much less proposing that writers feign detachment or disinterest, so much as noting that her political writing is much cruder and more scolding than her fiction (or, in this case, her straightforward reminiscences as a memoirist). The problem is not that Roy has chosen to write about politics but that she has done so with all the subtlety of a pamphleteer.

The incongruity of her two modes - the one searching and tentative, the other didactic and doctrinaire - becomes especially conspicuous when they appear side by side as they do here. On one page, she notes that she both loved and hated her mother; on the next, she describes a half-finished dam that destroyed a local ecosystem as "a monument to greed and irresponsibility." For what it's worth, I think she is right about the dam – but that does not make the observation any less predictable or "Mother Mary Comes to Me" any more

Still, this memoir is full of precise imagery and blistering emotional intelligence when it treats human relations. It is no accident that Roy is at her most meticulous and probing when she focuses on the person who taught her that a woman, too, can be a full-fledged human being - both a marvel and a monster, both a teacher and a tyrant. "Perhaps even more than a daughter mourning the passing of her mother," Roy muses, "I mourn her as a writer who has lost her most enthralling subject." Mrs. Roy is not only this book's eponym but its heroine, and by far its most interesting character.

Happily, the example that she set endures. After all, she was a teacher, and her lessons are bound to outlive her. When Roy visited her mother's school, she often found herself "wishing I were her student and not her daughter." I think she is underselling herself. At her most captivating and her least homiletic, she is both.


