India And Its Diaspora: A Partnership The World Can't Afford To Ignore

Against the breathtaking backdrop of Nandi Hills outside Bengaluru, leaders from 23 countries, technologists, investors, philanthropists, artists, policymakers, and scholars, gathered for the Indiaspora Forum 2026. Over four days, they engaged with India's own changemakers in conversations that reflected a simple but powerful truth: **India and its diaspora need each other, and the world needs both.**

This is not a new idea for us at Indiaspora. Since our founding in 2012, we have believed that when this relationship is intentionally cultivated, it creates value far beyond borders. What was once a thesis is now increasingly visible as reality.

The timing could not be more critical. The world is at an inflection point. Geopolitical tensions are rising, economic alignments are shifting, and the global rules-based order is under strain. As economist Gita Gopinath noted at the Forum, geopolitics and economics are now deeply intertwined in ways that directly impact India. She highlighted a striking reality: a third of the Indian diaspora lives in the Middle East, which also accounts for a third of India's remittances. Yet her broader point was even more important, the Indian diaspora is not only thriving globally but contributing meaningfully both where it resides and back to India.

For too long, those contributions have been viewed narrowly through remittances. At the Forum, we released a landmark report that reframes this narrative. The diaspora's impact spans technology, political influence, cultural diplomacy, research, and philanthropy. It is not just about capital, it is about ideas, institutions, and influence.

As Dr. Mohanbir Sawhney, Professor at Northwestern School of Business observed, "The Indian diaspora helped build many of the world's leading technology companies, while India's digital public infrastructure has become a global model for inclusive innovation. With artificial intelligence reshaping every industry, India and its diaspora have a once-in-a-generation opportunity to lead."

As Ursula von der Leyen, President of the European Commission noted in her address prior to the EU-India Free Trade Agreement, "India can play a unique role as a bridge between the Global South and the rest of the world." And we believe the diaspora can be a key part of that role.

Technology was a central theme throughout the Forum. Nandan Nilekani underscored how India's digital infrastructure, from Aadhaar to UPI, has created scalable solutions with global relevance. These are not just national achievements; they are global public goods in the making.

That momentum carried into the Global AI Summit, where Indiaspora, in partnership with Zinnov, a global management and strategy firm, released two major reports: India's Top 100 AI Startups and the evolving role of Global Capability Centers. The message was clear: India is no longer just executing ideas, it is co-creating them at the frontier of innovation.

But what makes this movement truly distinctive is

diaspora's connection to India is not only economic or political, it is deeply cultural and emotional. **Culture is diplomacy. Art is infrastructure.**

Bengaluru was a fitting host. As India's technology capital, it represents the country's ambition and momentum. With a young population, expanding innovation ecosystem, and a bold vision of becoming a developed nation by 2047, India stands at a defining moment.

The diaspora has an indispensable role to play in that journey, not as benefactors, but as partners. It brings global networks, expertise, capital, and perspective. India offers scale, dynamism, and a living laboratory for solving complex global challenges.

This is not transactional. It is a relationship, one with deep roots and vast potential.

At Indiaspora, our role is to nurture that relationship: to create spaces where trust is built, ideas are exchanged, and action follows. The Forum in Bengaluru was a powerful reminder of what is possible when intention and capability are aligned.

The world is watching. And together, India and its diaspora are ready to lead and serve as a force for good.

not just technological ambition, it is intellectual and cultural breadth. As Dr. Priyamvada Natarajan, Chair, Department of Astronomy at Yale University, and Indiaspora Board Member noted, Indiaspora's strength lies in convening diverse leaders committed to sharing knowledge across generations. This is a community grounded in purpose.

That spirit was reflected in a powerful plenary featuring Sri Sri Ravi Shankar and Smriti Irani, alongside cultural icons like Usha Uthup and Ricky Kej. Their presence underscored an often-overlooked truth: the

Indian American Running For Mayor Of The Nation's Capital

Thirty-one year-old Rini Sampath tells you right off the bat that she is not a politician. But she is running for Mayor of Washington, D.C., the center of all things political. She says she is running as an 'outsider.'

She declared her candidacy on February 18, posting on Facebook urging friends and family to support her.

The Democratic primary is scheduled to be held June 16, when Sampath faces off against at least 8 other party enthusiasts, and a Green Party candidate, seeking the nomination. Sampath has already made history by throwing her hat into the ring to become the first woman of Indian origin seeking to run this city.

Born in Theni, Tamil Nadu, and brought up in the US from the age of 7, Sampath is entering politics from a place where many Democrats find their way into the arena – social organizing, liberal activism, public service, and the non-profit world.

Having lived for the last 10 years in D.C., Sampath's platform rests on her experience as a federal contractor and before that as a student activist and field organizer.

"I'm a federal contractor who has spent my career improving government programs and citizen services," she says on her website riniformayor.com.

She says public service has shaped her. She helped lead the first all-women ticket when she was elected Student Body President at University of Southern California; She worked in neighborhoods as a field organizer; and she has managed higher education nonprofit programs.

"When institutions fall short, I organize, I speak up,

and I work to change them," asserts Sampath, who sees Washington as another of those kinds of places which are falling short of delivering promises to its residents.

"Washington, DC is one of the best cities in the world to live in, despite the failures of our city leaders," she maintains. But she has a bigger dream – of having a government that "pairs competence with creativity" to achieve "vibrant neighborhoods, strong local economies, and a shared sense that the city is moving forward. That's my dream for DC."

Not being a politician means she is also not enamored to special interest groups, she notes.

"It's time for an outsider who is relentlessly focused on fixing our basic city services. That's why I'm in the race to be your new Mayor, and I hope we can work together to create a better DC," she says to rally support.

Sampath points to the recent February snowstorm that engulfed the capital, to make her case for a dysfunctional city – "when neighbors couldn't leave their homes, people with disabilities were stranded, and workers lost income because the city failed to deliver basic services."

That is what catapulted her into the race. "For me, this was the straw that broke the camel's back," says the Indian American candidate, after more than a decade of watching City Hall "fall short on its basic promises."

"As Mayor, I'll take inspiration from world-class cities that work well and apply those lessons in ways that fit Washington. That means a safer and more affordable DC, a thriving economy, and a better life for you," Sampath promises.

"Running for Mayor to fix the basics," is the motto on Sampath's X.com site.

D.C. Mayoral Candidate Rini Sampath's Plan To "Fix The Basics"

On her campaign website riniformayor.com, Sampath says, "Too often, city insiders run campaigns built around empty promises without explaining how they'll actually deliver for DC. But we have a plan."

Among the highlights of Sampath's plan, in her words, are :

1. LEAD WITH TRANSPARENCY AND ACCOUNTABILITY –

DC collects performance data but doesn't use it to manage the city. Audits show city agency failures persist because data is fragmented, accountability is unclear, and failures don't trigger consequences.

On day one, I will review every open DC Auditor report and performance dashboard to identify where the city is missing benchmarks and where residents are paying the price. We'll deploy a team of data and technology experts to translate findings into action.

Drawing on best practices from cities like New York and San Diego, we'll build digital tools that let residents report issues, track responses in real time, and see whether the city met its deadlines. We'll use this to identify gaps and allocate resources to closing them.

DC already has the data. We'll finally use it to fix problems faster and manage the city budget responsibly.

2. REVAMP CITY HALL'S CULTURE AND SETTING HIGHER PERFORMANCE STANDARD —

DC Auditor reports show agencies struggle with unclear leadership, inconsistent performance management, and weak follow-through. But performance is

also a culture problem. High-performing organizations combine accountability with trust: people know who's responsible, what success looks like, and that leadership has their back.

As Mayor, I'll recruit senior leaders with experience running complex organizations and building healthy teams while empowering existing city government talent. I will hold them to clear expectations:

1. Defined goals tied to resident outcomes
2. Measurable benchmarks published publicly
3. Performance reviews informed by data, not politics
4. Leadership accountability for staff engagement and morale

3. LEARN FROM CITIES THAT WORK –

Copenhagen's street redesigns prioritizing pedestrians and cyclists helped achieve among the lowest traffic fatality rates in the world. Madrid's low-emission zones measurably reduced pollution. Seoul's digital governance reforms improved service delivery and public trust.

We will bring in leading urban planning, transportation, environmental, and public-management experts

to study what worked and why. **We'll adapt proven strategies to DC's legal authority, fiscal constraints, and neighborhoods.**

4. PUBLIC ACCOUNTABILITY IN THE OPEN –

The city publishes data, but residents can't understand who's responsible, whether timelines are met, or what happens when they aren't. Performance information is scattered across dashboards that are difficult to use.

Under my administration:

1. Every major initiative will have a publicly identified City Hall leader responsible for delivery
2. Strategic plans will be published early with clear goals, timelines, and success metrics
3. Residents will receive regular, plain-language updates on what's working and what isn't
4. Digital dashboards will make performance visible without digging through technical reports

5. RUN THE CITY WITH FISCAL DISCIPLINE AND DRIVE MODERN REVENUE GROWTH –

Federal employment declines and high commercial vacancy are weakening DC's revenue base, contributing to projected budget shortfalls that jeopardize city services, schools, public safety, and infrastructure. We can't simply cut costs. We need to broaden our economic base.

As Mayor, I'll conduct a full review of the city's revenue mix to identify where revenue is concentrated, volatile, or misaligned with economic realities. We'll pursue growth-oriented strategies: supporting small businesses, revitalizing underused commercial space, and strengthening visitor economy revenues.

Flagship Initiative

Project 'Life' adopted the village of Ghed Bagasara in 2018 and has been regularly conducting Thalassaemia screening test and awareness programs. This ongoing effort has become a successful model for village level prevention, with no Thalassaemia minor cases reported in the past couple of years. Further strengthening this mission, Project 'Life' has received generous support from Mrs. Rika & Mr. Manu Shah of California, USA, through their Shah Happiness Foundation, which has pledged to sponsor 30,000 Thalassaemia screening tests annually. 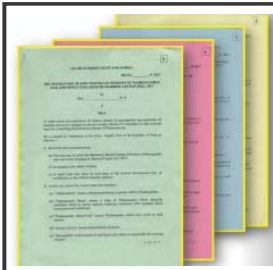

'Ketamine Queen' Jasveen Sangha, Sentenced To 15 Years Over Matthew Perry's Death

Jasveen Sangha, a drug dealer who pleaded guilty in September 2025 to drug-related charges, including providing actor Matthew Perry with the dose of ketamine that killed him, was sentenced Wednesday to 15 years in prison Wednesday. Keta

Sangha, 42, was known to her clients as the "Ketamine Queen," according to court documents. Following an investigation into the "Friends" actor's fatal overdose in 2023 at age 54, Sangha was charged alongside four others in August 2024. She pleaded guilty to one count of using her home for drug distribution, three counts of distribution of ketamine and one count of distribution of ketamine resulting in death.

Before her guilty plea, Sangha's attorney, Mark Geragos, denied the allegations against Sangha, saying in a documentary last year that she had "never met Matthew Perry." Sangha, who has been in custody since August 2024, is a dual citizen of the United States and Britain. Ahead of Sangha's sentencing, prosecutors asked Judge Sherilyn Peace Garnett to sentence Sangha to 15 years in prison.

In a victim impact statement filed Tuesday that read like a poem, Perry's stepmother, Debbie Perry, asked the court for a maximum sentence for Sangha. "The pain you've caused/ to hundreds maybe thousands," she wrote, "Is irreversible."

Matthew Perry, best known for his role as Chandler Bing on "Friends," the sitcom that became a cultural behemoth in the



Jasveen Sangha.

1990s, wrote openly about his struggles with addiction. In his 2022 memoir, "Friends, Lovers, and the Big Terrible Thing," he recounted his struggles with Vicodin, alcohol, cocaine, Xanax and Suboxone, as well as scores of rehab stints.

"You can track the trajectory of my addiction if you gauge my weight from season to season," Perry wrote of his 10 seasons on "Friends." "When I'm carrying weight, it's alcohol. When I'm skinny, it's pills. When I have a goatee, it's lots of pills."

He also starred in films such as "The Whole Nine Yards" (2000) and "17 Again" (2009), and was Emmy-nominated for his

appearances on "The West Wing" and in the TV movie "The Ron Clark Story."

Perry was found dead in a hot tub at his home in October 2023. Around the time of his death, Perry had been receiving ketamine infusion therapy for depression and anxiety, but was also addicted to the drug, according to prosecutors.

The Los Angeles County medical examiner's office concluded the actor had died of the acute effects of ketamine, ruling the death an accident with no signs of foul play, before an investigation was launched into the death.

Sangha is the third of the suspects connected to Perry's death to be charged.

In December, Salvador Plasencia was sentenced to 2½ years in prison for multiple drug charges. Later that month, Mark Chavez received a sentence of eight months of home confinement. Both Plasencia and Chavez are physicians.

Perry's acquaintance Erik Fleming and his live-in assistant Kenneth Iwamasa both pleaded guilty to a single count of conspiracy to distribute ketamine in October 2024, and will be sentenced in the coming weeks.

Pakistani National Pleads Guilty To Attempting To Commit Isis-Inspired Attack At Jewish Center In New York

EXTRACTS FROM JUSTICE DEPARTMENT PRESS RELEASE

The Justice Department announced April 8, 2026, that Muhammad Shahzeb Khan, also known as "Shahzeb Jadoon," pleaded guilty to attempting to commit acts of terrorism transcending national boundaries, for attempting to enter the United States and carry out a mass shooting with automatic weapons at a prominent Jewish center in Brooklyn, New York. Khan pleaded guilty before U.S. District Judge Paul G. Gardephe and is scheduled to be sentenced on Aug. 12, 2026.

As alleged in the charging instruments and other public filings:

In or about November 2023, Khan, a Pakistani national residing in Canada, began posting on social media and communicating with others about his support for ISIS, including by distributing ISIS propaganda videos and literature. Khan subsequently began planning terrorist attacks in the United States in support of ISIS, including by communicating his plans with two individuals who, unbeknownst to Khan, were undercover officers (the UCs). Khan told the UCs that he and a U.S.-based associate

(Associate-1) had been planning to carry out a terrorist attack in a particular U.S. city (City-1) using AR-style assault rifles to "target[] Israeli Jewish chabads . . . scattered all around [City-1]." [1] Khan repeatedly instructed the UCs to obtain AR-style assault rifles, ammunition, and other materials to carry out the attacks, and identified locations in City-1 where the attacks would take place. Khan also told the UCs that he had identified a human smuggler who would help him cross the border from Canada into the United States for the attack.

In or about August 2024, Khan changed his target to New York City, telling the UCs that the target location would now be a prominent Jewish religious center in Brooklyn, New York (Location-1). Khan conveyed that he hoped to carry out this attack on or around October 7, 2024 — which Khan recognized as the one-year anniversary of the brutal and deadly terrorist attacks in Israel carried out by the foreign terrorist organization Hamas on October 7, 2023. Khan told the UCs that "New York is perfect to target jews" because it has the "largest Jewish population in america," and, as such, "even if we dont attack a[n] Event[,] we could rack up easily a lot of jews." Khan told the UCs that "we are going to nyc to slaughter them," and later sent a photograph to the UCs of the

specific enclosed area inside of Location-1 where Khan planned to carry out his attack. In the days that followed, Khan continued to urge the UCs to acquire AR-style rifles, hunting knives to "slit their throats," and other equipment for the attack, and reiterated his desire to carry out this attack in support of ISIS. During one such communication, Khan noted that "if we succeed with our plan this would be the largest Attack on US soil since 9/11."

On or about Sept. 4, 2024, Khan attempted to reach the U.S.-Canada border using a human smuggler. Khan traveled from the vicinity of Toronto, Canada, toward the United States, before he was stopped and arrested in or around Ormstown, Canada, approximately 12 miles from the U.S.-Canada border.

Khan, 21, a Pakistani citizen who was residing in Canada, pleaded guilty to one count of attempting to commit acts of terrorism transcending national boundaries, which carries a maximum penalty of life in prison.

The potential maximum penalty in this case is prescribed by Congress and provided here for informational purposes only, as any sentencing of the defendant will be determined by a judge.

Dr. Rachna Shroff Appointed First Head Of New Cancer Center Initiative At University Of Arizona

Dr. Rachna Shroff, associate director of clinical research, was chosen as the first to hold the new John F. and Valli S. Duval Endowed Professorship for Gastrointestinal Oncology at the University of Arizona College of Medicine–Tucson's Comprehensive Cancer Center. The Professorship was announced March 18, 2026, established through a \$1 million gift from John and Valli Duval to support cancer research and clinical innovation at the University of Arizona Comprehensive Cancer Center. A ceremony on March 12 recognized Shroff and her new professorship.

The endowed professorship honors Dr. Shroff's career as a "prolific physician-scientist, mentor and national leader in oncology," the University said.

The gift also aims to support sustained investment in clinical trials and compassionate patient care at the Cancer Center, the only National Cancer Institute-designated comprehensive cancer center headquartered in Arizona.

"I'm honored to have been chosen for this inaugural endowed professorship and extremely grateful to the Duvals for their generosity," Shroff is quoted saying in the press release. "This gift will allow the Cancer Center to continue to invest in clinical trials, which are the only way to move the needle forward in cancer

care. Every single cure that we now have for cancer started with a clinical trial."

The Duvals' gift is expected to help accelerate clinical research and expand access to innovative treatments for patients.

"The Duvals have spent a lifetime supporting academic medicine, and I thank them for this gift that will allow the Cancer Center and Dr. Shroff to continue to search for treatments and therapies that will benefit patients," said Dr. Dan

Theodorescu, director of the Cancer Center and the Nancy C. and Craig M. Berge Endowed Chair. "Dr. Shroff's impact is evident not only in the scientific discoveries she has contributed to the field, but also in her leadership and steadfast determination to advance clinical trials that can lead to better outcomes for Arizonans."

Shroff, who is also chief of the Division of Hematology and Oncology at the College of Medicine – Tucson and medical

director of the oncology service line at Banner – University Medical Center Tucson, "has dedicated her career to advancing immunological therapies and novel drug treatments while never losing sight of the human side of medicine," the University said. At the U of A, she has built a high-performing gastrointestinal oncology program and works to ensure patients have access to the latest scientific advances, it added.

"Dr. Shroff's research has helped usher in an era of personalized medicine, where doctors can target cancers based on each patient's unique biology," said Tomás Díaz de la Rubia, senior vice president for research and partnerships.

Dr. Shroff is internationally recognized for her work in bile duct cancer, or cholangiocarcinoma. She started focusing on the rare and historically difficult-to-treat disease when few treatment options existed and no Food and Drug Administration-approved therapies were available. "Today, the field has changed dramatically, due in part to the landmark clinical trials Shroff has led as a principal investigator," the University said.

"Philanthropy plays a critical role in attracting and retaining physician-scientists like Dr. Shroff, whose work touches the lives of patients and their families every day," said John-Paul Roczniak, president and CEO of the University of Arizona Foundation.

The Voice Of A Billion Hearts: Remembering Asha Bhosle

-APRIL 12, 2026

With the passing of Asha Bhosle at the age of 92, the world of music has lost not merely a singer but an era, a soundscape, and a living archive of emotion.

Her voice, at once playful and profound, sensuous and spiritual, echoed across generations, languages, and continents.

She passed away on Sunday at Breach Candy Hospital due to multi-organ failure,

bringing to a close a life that had, for over eight decades, defined the very soul of Indian music.

To attempt to summarize Asha Bhosle's legacy is to attempt the impossible. She was not just prolific, though her over thousands of recorded songs in multiple languages earned her a Guinness World Record as the most recorded artist in history, but also transformative.

She did not simply sing songs; she reshaped how songs could be sung, how emotions could be conveyed, and how a voice could transcend boundaries of genre, age, and expectation.

Born Asha Mangeshkar on September 8, 1933, in Sangli, she entered a household steeped in classical music. The daughter of the revered Pt Deenanath Mangeshkar and the younger sister of Lata Mangeshkar, her destiny seemed intertwined with melody from the very beginning.

Yet her journey was far from easy. The sudden death of her father when she was just nine years old made her and her sister step into the world of playback singing. Asha Bhosle's breakthrough came in 1957 with 'Naya Daur', in collaboration with composer OP Nayyar.

It was a turning point that revealed her unique tonal quality which was playful, expressive, and daring.

Soon, she became the unmistakable voice behind some of Hindi cinema's most vivacious characters, especially for the iconic dancer Helen.

Songs like 'Piya Tu Ab To Aaja' and 'Yeh Mera Dil Yaar Ka Diwana' didn't just entertain; they redefined sensuality in Indian film music.

Yet, to reduce Asha Bhosle to cabaret numbers would be to miss the essence of her genius. She was, above all, an artist of astonishing versatility. When she lent her voice to the ghazals of 'Umrao Jaan' in 1981, she showed the world her classical depth.

'Dil Cheez Kya Hai' and 'In Aankhon Ki Masti' were not just songs; they were masterclasses in restraint and nuance. For this, she earned her first National Film Award, affirming her place among the greats of Indian classical and semi-classical music.

Her ability to evolve with time was perhaps her most remarkable trait. Decades into her career, she embraced change with the curiosity of a newcomer.

Her collaboration with AR Rahman in 'Rangeela' (1995), particularly in songs like 'Tanha Tanha,' stunned audiences, here was a voice in its sixties sounding fresher and contemporary just like the singers half her age. She even ventured beyond Indian music, collaborating with international artists and genres, proving that her artistry knew no borders.

Recognition followed her at every stage. She was awarded the Padma Vibhushan, India's second-highest civilian honor, in 2008. The Dadasaheb Phalke Award, Indian cinema's most prestigious recognition, came in 2000. She won multiple Filmfare Awards and received international acclaim, including a historic Grammy nomination in 1997 for her album 'Legacy.'

Beyond the recording studio, Asha Bhosle was also a

passionate cook, often saying in her interviews that had she not been a singer, she would have been a chef. This was no idle claim. She transformed her love for food into a thriving global restaurant chain, 'Asha's,' which brought her personal recipes to diners across Dubai, the

UK, and the Middle East.

Speaking about her personal journey, she was married first to Ganpatrao Bhosle and later to the legendary composer RD Burman. She shared with the latter a partnership that was both creatively explosive and deeply affectionate. Their collaborations produced some of the most iconic songs in Indian cinema including, 'Dum Maro Dum', 'Mera Kuchh Samaan', 'Duniya Mein Logon Ko', 'Jaane Jaan Dhoondta Phir Raha', 'O Mere Sona Re Sona', and 'Do Lafzon Ki Hai Dil Ki Kahani', among many others.

Even after his passing in 1994, his influence remained intertwined with her music.

To understand Asha Bhosle is to listen, not casually, but attentively.

From the seductive allure of 'Piya Tu Ab To Aaja,' to the aching elegance of 'Dil Cheez Kya Hai,' from the breezy romance of 'Chura Liya Hai Tumne,' to the youthful exuberance of 'Tanha Tanha,' her repertoire is a map of human emotion.

Each song represents not just a moment in cinema, but a moment in the listener's life.

Her passing marks the end of an era, but her voice will never truly fall silent. It will live on, in vinyl records and streaming playlists, in nostalgic recollections and new discoveries, in kitchens and concert halls, in heart-break and celebration.

She is survived by her son Anand Bhosle and several grandchildren.

On Sunday, Anand Bhosle confirmed the death of her mother and the details of her last rite. "People can pay their last respects to her at 11 am tomorrow at Casa Grande, Lower Parel, where she lived. Her last rites will be performed at 4 pm tomorrow at Shivaji Park," he told media.

Maharashtra Minister Ashish Shelar also mourned the demise of the melody queen and announced that she will be cremated with full state honours.

Speaking to the media, Shelar said the entire country and Maharashtra are mourning the end of an era, adding that Bhosle's contribution to music brought joy not only to India but also to audiences across the world.

"Today, the entire country and Maharashtra are mourning the end of an era. Her work and her music were a source of joy not only for India but for the entire world," he said.

In a heartfelt message on X, Prime Minister Modi expressed deep sorrow, calling Bhosle "one of the most iconic and versatile voices India has ever known."

He credited her extraordinary musical journey spanning decades for enriching India's cultural heritage and said her songs would continue to inspire generations.

"Her voice carried timeless brilliance," he wrote, adding that he would always cherish his personal interactions with the singer.

"Deeply saddened by the passing of Asha Bhosle Ji, one of the most iconic and versatile voices India has ever known. Her extraordinary musical journey, spanning decades, enriched our cultural heritage and touched countless hearts across the world. Be it her soulful melodies or vibrant compositions, her voice carried timeless brilliance. I'll always cherish the interactions I've had with her. My condolences to her family, admirers and music lovers. She will continue to inspire generations and her songs will forever echo in people's lives," PM Modi wrote.

For as long as there are songs to be sung and hearts to feel them, Asha Bhosle will remain timeless, irreplaceable, and eternal.

H-1B Selected but Denied? What to Do After an RFE or Petition Denial

Being selected in the H-1B lottery is a major milestone. However, selection alone does not guarantee approval. Many H-1B petitions receive Requests for Evidence (RFEs), and in some cases, petitions are ultimately denied.

When this happens, both employers and employees are often left asking: what are the next steps?

Understanding the options available after an RFE or denial is critical to maintaining lawful status and preserving employment opportunities.

Understanding the H-1B Process After Selection

After an H-1B registration is selected in the lottery, the employer must file a complete H-1B petition with USCIS. During the review process, USCIS may:

- Approve the petition
- Issue a Request for Evidence (RFE)
- Deny the petition

An RFE or denial does not always mean the end of the case, but it does require careful and timely action.

What Is a Request for Evidence (RFE)?

An RFE is issued when USCIS determines that additional information is needed before a decision can be made.

Common Reasons for RFEs

- Questions about whether the job qualifies as a specialty occupation
- Concerns about the employer-employee relationship
- Wage level or job classification issues
- Incomplete documentation
- Maintenance of status issues

An RFE provides an opportunity to strengthen the case, but the response must be thorough and well-documented.

What Happens After Receiving an RFE?

Receiving an RFE means the case is still under review.

At this stage:

- USCIS will provide a deadline for response
- The employer must submit all requested evidence
- The quality of the response is critical

A strong RFE response can lead to approval, while a weak or incomplete response may result in denial.

What If the H-1B Petition Is Denied?

A denial can be difficult, but there may still be options available depending on the situation.

Motion to Reopen or Reconsider

In some cases, it may be possible to file a motion to reopen or reconsider if there was an error in the decision or if additional evidence is available.

Refiling the Petition

Refiling may be possible in limited situations, particularly if the issue can be corrected. However, cap-related restrictions may apply, depending on timing and eligibility.

Exploring Alternative Visa Options

Employers and employees should consider other visa categories, such as:

- O-1 for individuals with extraordinary ability
- L-1 for multinational companies
- TN, E-3, or H-1B1 based on nationality
- Cap-exempt H-1B opportunities

Each option depends on the individual's qualifications and the employer's structure.

What If the Petition Is Approved but Change of Status Is Denied?

In some cases, USCIS may approve the H-1B petition itself but deny the change of status request. This can occur when there are issues related to the applicant's underlying status in the United States.

In this situation:

- The H-1B petition may remain valid for consular processing
- The employee may need to leave the United States and apply for an H-1B visa at a U.S. consulate abroad

Employers should also be aware that, depending on the circumstances and applicable regulations, there may be financial implications, including potential responsibility for government-imposed fees associated with the filing.

Because of the complexity of these cases, it is important to carefully evaluate both the immigration and compliance aspects before proceeding.

Can the Employee Continue Working After a Denial?

This is one of the most common and urgent questions.

The answer depends on the employee's underlying status:

- If the individual was working on OPT, work authorization may end upon denial (depending on timing)
- If the individual was already in H-1B status, the situation may differ
- If no other valid work authorization exists, employment must stop immediately

Maintaining lawful status is critical, and employers should act quickly to assess next steps.

Impact on F-1 Students and OPT

For F-1 students:

- STEM OPT may still be available if eligible
- A grace period may apply
- A change of status may be considered

Timing is especially important, as falling out of status can have long-term immigration consequences.

Asha Bhosle Family Tree: Take A Look At Revered Musical Lineage Of Legendary Singer

Legendary singer Asha Bhosle passed away at the age of 92 years on Sunday. Apart from her illustrious career, the singer also had a closely knit family that stood by her through decades of fame and personal milestones.

Born into the legendary Mangeshkar family, Asha Bhosle was the sister of the late singer Lata Mangeshkar, Usha Mangeshkar, Meena Khadikar and Hridaynath Mangeshkar. She is the daughter of late legendary musician Deenanath Mangeshkar.

The 'Saathi Haath Badhana' singer married twice in her lifetime. Her first marriage was to Ganpatrao Bhosle, with whom she had three children, including Hemant Bhosle, Varsha Bhosle and Anand Bhosale. Later, she

married renowned music composer Rahul Dev Burman, leading to one of the most iconic musical partnerships in Bollywood history.

Their legendary collaborations include classics like 'Dum Maro Dum,' 'Piya Tu Ab To Aaja,' 'Chura Liya Hai Tumne,' 'Mera Kuchh Samaan, and others.

Asha Bhosle had three children—two sons and one daughter—from her first marriage. Her son Hemant Bhosle pursued a music career and has composed music for movies like Dharam Shatru (1988), Sansani: The Sensation (1981) and RajaJogi (1983). He passed away in 2015.

Her second son, Anand Bhosle, reportedly manages her professional work, while her daughter Varsha Bhosle, who was a journalist, passed away in 2012.

The family also extends to grandchildren, many of whom have maintained a low public profile but are closely connected to the legacy of the legendary singer. One of them is Zanai Bhosle who is often spotted with Asha Bhosle. She is also quite active on the social media where she posts heartwarming photos with her grandmother and singer Asha Bhosle.

The Mangeshkar family is widely considered one of India's most influential musical dynasties. Alongside Lata Mangeshkar, the family features prominent figures such as Usha Mangeshkar and Meena Khadikar, all of whom played a key role in shaping the golden era of Indian music.

Farewell To Melody Queen: Asha Bhosle Cremated With Full State Honors, Son Anand Lights Funeral Pyre

Legendary singer Asha Bhosle was cremated with full state honours on Monday at the Shivaji Park Crematorium in Mumbai, where a large gathering of mourners came together to pay their final respects to the iconic voice that enthralled generations for more than eight decades.

Wrapped in the tricolour, the mortal remains of Asha Bhosle, fondly known as "Asha Tai," were consigned to flames following a traditional gun salute by the Mumbai Police.

The city witnessed an emotional day as fans, political leaders, and members of the film and music industry came together to pay their last respects to the melody queen.

Her last rites were performed by her son Anand.

The legendary vocalist was also given a musical tribute by singers Shaan and Sudesh Bhosale, who also gave a musical tribute minutes before bidding her a final goodbye.

Several well-known faces from the film world arrived to pay floral tributes to the legendary singer. Actors Vicky Kaushal, Aamir Khan, Vivek Oberoi, Padmini Kola-puri and Jackie Shroff were among those seen at Shivaji Park.

Apart from the film industry, several senior political leaders were also present at the crematorium. Maharashtra Chief

Minister Devendra Fadnavis and Deputy Chief Minister Eknath Shinde attended the funeral and paid floral tributes to the iconic singer.

NCP-SCP MP Supriya Sule, Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray, Rashmi Thackeray, and Aaditya Thackeray also visited to offer their respects.

Actors Ranveer Singh and Riteish Deshmukh also visited her residence earlier in the day to offer condolences. Veteran filmmaker Rakesh Roshan also paid tribute to the singer whose songs defined generations of Hindi cinema.

Her mortal remains were earlier kept at her residence for public homage, draped in the Tricolour. Long queues of admirers were seen outside the home, with many offering flowers, folding hands in prayer, and remembering the singer through tears.

Among other dignitaries who paid tribute were Maharashtra Governor Jishnu Dev Varma and state minister Mangal Prabhat Lodha.

Music composer Uttam Singh remembered Asha Bhosle not just as a great artist but as a warm-hearted human being.

Recalling an old memory, he shared how she once cooked food for his team late at night after a recording session.

"It was around 1:30 at night. As we were about to leave, she saw us and asked us to wait. Within minutes, she went inside, cooked chicken and rice herself, and insisted we eat before leaving. She was that kind of person," he said.

Soon after the news of her death broke on Sunday, April 12, tributes poured in from across the country.

Film Review: A Hamlet In Conflict: Riz Ahmed Navigates An Uneasy Adaptation

Adapting Hamlet into a contemporary setting is an ambitious creative gamble, and this film opens on a striking note—with the haunting visual of a man performing last rites, immediately grounding the story in a cultural space that feels intimate and evocative.

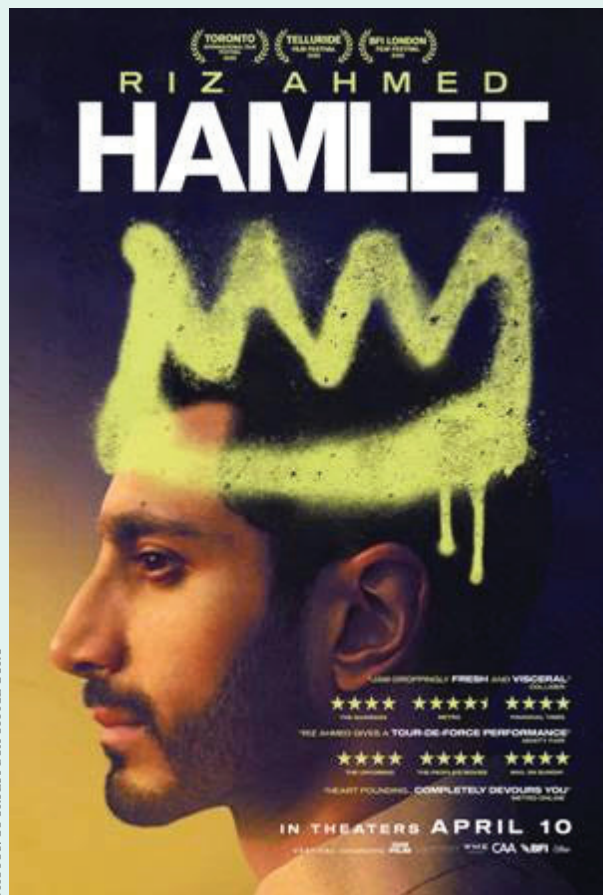
Directed by Aneil Karia and led by Riz Ahmed, the film premiered at major festivals before its wider rollout. After its U.K. release earlier this year, it is set to open in the United States on April 10, 2026, in select theaters.

The performances are intense and committed. The cinematography is stark and controlled, while the background score effectively amplifies Hamlet's psychological unrest. And yet, this is where the film begins to feel conflicted.

Indian cinema has already shown us what a truly immersive Shakespeare adaptation can look like—through the work of Vishal Bhardwaj. With *Maqbool* (inspired by *Macbeth*) and *Omkara* (based on *Othello*), Bhardwaj demonstrated how Shakespeare's themes could be transplanted into Indian socio-political landscapes without losing their essence. But it is *Haider* that stands as the most compelling benchmark for any modern adaptation of Hamlet.

Haider did not simply retell Shakespeare—it reimagined him. Set against the turbulent backdrop of Kashmir, the film absorbed the emotional, political, and cultural realities of its setting so completely that the story felt organic, not imposed. The characters were re-named, reshaped, and rooted in their environment. The language was accessible yet poetic. The conflicts were not just personal but deeply political, giving the narrative a lived-in authenticity.

Most importantly, *Haider* trusted its audience. It did not rely on Shakespearean dialogue to prove its lineage. Instead, it translated the spirit of Hamlet into a form that felt immediate, cinematic, and culturally resonant. Even its most theatrical moments—songs like “Bismil,” for instance—were staged with a scale and intent that enhanced the storytelling rather than distancing the

viewer.

This is where the current film feels uncertain.

It doesn't fully commit to being a South Asian adaptation, nor does it remain purely Western. Cultural elements appear, but without clear integration. A traditional song like *Dama Dam Mast Qalandar* surfaces in the staging but feels disconnected. Gertrude is styled with an Indian aesthetic, a wedding features *lehen-gas*, while Claudius—Hamlet's stepfather—appears as an Englishman dressed in a sherwani and traditional Indian headgear.

The question that arises is simple: why?

These choices feel visual rather than narrative—layered in, but not lived in.

This tension continues in the film's language and structure. The characters retain their original names—Hamlet, Gertrude, Claudius, Ophelia—and speak almost entirely in Shakespearean English, even as they navigate a modern world of clubs, fractured relationships, and substance use. The result is a tonal dissonance that keeps the audience at a distance.

Perhaps this was intentional. Perhaps the director is engaging with the very dilemma at the heart of the play: “To be, or not to be.”

To be faithful, or not to be?

To adapt, or to preserve?

But in trying to hold on to both, the film never fully becomes either.

There is sincerity in the performances, and the technical craft—particularly the cinematography and background score—adds texture to the film's psychological landscape. But, as is often said, even the most unusual worlds can feel real if they are cohesive. Here, that cohesion remains elusive.

The film ultimately caters to a niche audience—those who appreciate theatre and Shakespeare in its original form. For a wider audience, it risks feeling inaccessible. A more grounded approach—either fully embracing localization, as Bhardwaj did, or committing entirely to a stylized theatrical form—might have created a stronger impact.

And yet, this is not a careless film. It is a deliberate one. A risk taken with intent. For the director's sake, one hopes the gamble pays off.

In the end, the film exists in a liminal space—between cultures, between forms, between identities. Much like Hamlet himself, it seems caught in indecision, unable to fully answer the question it poses.

Vow to pack light

Plan for pain-free flying

The hours-long lines that plagued airport security checkpoints last month appear to be in the rearview for now. But the warnings from some airports to arrive more than four hours early are hard to forget. To give yourself the best chance of breezing through lines, sign up for the expedited service (such as TSA PreCheck or Clear) that makes the most sense for you. If you have PreCheck already, enroll in TSA PreCheck Touchless ID before checking in for your flight if you want to speed up the process even more at participating airports (facial scan required).

Make sure you're prepared to sail through the TSA line by emptying your pockets, avoiding clothes that set off alarms and checking your bags in advance for potential red flags. And brush up on all the flying etiquette you need to know, like whom to tip, how to best use the overhead bin and when to let your neighbor chill in peace.

Hit the road like a boss

Don't wait too long to start planning a summer road trip. Decide where you want to go, research the routes, make reservations, order gear and prep the car with plenty of time before heading out. Cricket-Women's T20 World Cup To Have \$8.8 Million Prize Pool

This year's Women's Twenty20 World Cup will have a tournament-record prize pool of \$8.8 million with the winners set to earn \$2.3 million, the International Cricket Council (ICC) said on Monday.

The 12-team competition will be held in England and Wales from June 12, with New Zealand set to defend the maiden title they won in 2024.

"The runners-up will receive \$1.17 million. Both losing semi-finalists will earn \$675,000 each," the ICC said in a statement, adding that every participating team was guaranteed a minimum prize of \$248,000.

The prize pool will be smaller than those at the men's and women's World Cups held in the Indian subcontinent in the last three years.

Last year's 50-over Women's World Cup in

India and Sri Lanka had a prize pool of \$13.9 million, the highest pot at an ICC event, and a 297% increase from its previous edition in 2022. Champions India took home \$4.5 million.

The 2023 edition of the men's 50-over World Cup, held in India, had a prize pot of \$10 million, while this year's men's T20 World Cup in India and Sri Lanka offered \$11.25 million in prize money.

"The continued rise of women's cricket through increased investment and opportunity reflects the growing influence and impact of female athletes on the global stage," the ICC's CEO Sanjog Gupta said.

From Cricket League To Economic Giant: IPL Valued At USD 18 Billion: Kotak MF

The Indian Premier League (IPL) has evolved into a multi-billion-dollar economic engine, contributing significantly to India's economy and redefining the business of sport, according to a recent report by Kotak Mutual Fund.

The report noted that the IPL ecosystem is currently valued at around USD 18 billion as of FY25, placing it among the world's leading sporting leagues. Remarkably, a tournament spanning just two months now generates economic value comparable to India's entire sports industry, estimated at about USD 19 billion.

According to the report, the league contributes between USD 182 million and USD 6.7 billion annually to the Indian economy through its wide-ranging ecosystem, including media, advertising, sponsorships, and ancillary sectors.

A key driver of IPL's financial growth has been its media rights, which have surged from USD 918 million in 2008 to USD 6.2 billion for the 2023-2027 cycle, reflecting a strong compounded annual growth rate and outpacing several global leagues.

The report highlighted that the IPL now reaches nearly one billion viewers across television and digital platforms, with digital consumption witnessing rapid growth. Advertising revenues alone are projected to reach around USD 600 million in 2025, indicating robust monetisation of viewership.

Kotak further noted that IPL franchises operate on a unique financial model, deriving over 70 per cent of their revenues from centrally shared media rights and sponsorship pools. This ensures predictable cash flows, making teams resemble "infrastructure-like assets" rather than

traditional sports clubs.

Beyond broadcasting, the league has diversified its revenue streams. Advertising revenues have grown exponentially since inception, while title sponsorship values and franchise-level sponsorships have also seen substantial increases, reflecting strong corporate interest in the platform.

The report also underscored the IPL's resilience, noting that despite temporary setbacks such as the pandemic-induced decline in valuations, the league has rebounded strongly, crossing USD 10 billion in value in recent years.

IPL is no longer just a cricket tournament but a "technology-led media ecosystem" and a major economic contributor with significant spillover effects across sectors, noted the report.

Cricket-Sooryavanshi's Hot Streak Continues In IPL As Rajasthan Down RCB

Teen sensation Vaibhav Sooryavanshi continued his stunning form in the Indian Premier League by smashing a 15-ball fifty to power Rajasthan Royals to a six-wicket win over defending champions Royal Challengers Bengaluru on Friday.

Chasing 202, the 15-year-old tore into the RCB attack with 78 off 26 balls, including eight fours and seven sixes, as Rajasthan reached the target with two overs to spare.

Sooryavanshi, who lit up his debut season with a 35-ball hundred last year, is just 11 matches into his IPL career and has already surged to the top of this season's run charts with 200 runs in four

innings at a strike rate of 266.6.

He registered his second 15-ball fifty of the campaign, having achieved the feat against Chennai Super Kings previously.

"We just cannot believe how someone can hit like that. He is a great talent and we feel good that he is in our team," said wicketkeeper-batter Dhruv Jurel.

After dominating India spearhead Jasprit Bumrah earlier in the week, Sooryavanshi passed another stern test against Josh Hazlewood, thrashing the returning Australia quick for three fours and a six in the first four balls he faced.

Sooryavanshi and Jurel set the tone with a rapid start, racing to 97-1 in the

powerplay before spinner Krunal Pandya stalled the momentum.

Rajasthan slipped from 129-1 to 134-4 when Pandya dismissed Sooryavanshi, but Jurel anchored the chase with a composed unbeaten 81 from 43 balls.

"When you go in, and Vaibhav is smashing every ball, you tend to think nothing is happening on the wicket. Cricket is not as easy as he's playing," Jurel added.

The 108-run stand between Jurel and Sooryavanshi proved decisive, keeping Rajasthan unbeaten at the top of the table while RCB remain third.

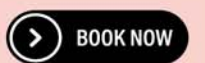
